SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

Today we enter a period of the Liturgical Calendar named 'Ordinary Time'. It is Ordinary in comparison to the special focus of Advent or Lent, Christmas or Easter. This is not a special season. The readings however have not fully left the Christmas/Epiphany themes behind. In fact the next three Sundays will call our attention to various Epiphany's of Jesus.

Today it is John's rendering of the beginning of his public ministry. Each Evangelist recalls this differently. John tells us of his arrival at a wedding celebration in the town of Cana. It has been asked over the years whether the crisis set off by running out of wine was due to he and his disciples being unexpected and somewhat thirsty guests. Is that why Mary calls on him to solve the problem. Perhaps, however, that is not the concern of John as he relates the incident, nor is it the concern of the liturgy as it uses this reading on this day. This is clearly yet another Epiphany of Jesus. He is being shown forth, revealed for who He is and recognized. That is what Epiphany is all about both seeing Him and recognizing or realizing what we are seeing. This week and the weeks ahead as the liturgy reminds us of several Epiphany moments we ought to ask: Do I recognize Him around me today...Do I realize what I am seeing? Remember I said last Sunday that in looking for him, look around the edges. God slips into our presence often unnoticed. Like the finest wine served at banquet after the guests had been drinking a long while. Their senses are dulled and many may not realize at all the quality of this wine. What has dulled my senses, clouded my sight? As we move away from the dazzle of Christmas into a more ordinary time look for Jesus presence. Once I see Him, well then I must respond, I must react. How will I react? How will Jesus make a difference in my life?

Be sure to call and let us know you are coming to the Volunteer Reception.

NEWS & NOTES...

Social Ministry:

Children At Risk-73,000 children in the 12 counties of the Diocese of Rochester are growing up in families with incomes at or below the federal poverty level (family of 4 about \$20,000). Yates County has the most poor children (21.9% of those under age 18) and Rochester is first in child poverty among New York's urban areas. Do you know how many children are poor in your county? The Catholic Campaign for Human Development website (www.povertyusa.org) offers some food for thought on how low-income families with children juggle and struggle to cover just the basic needs. For example, infant children can cost \$80-160 a week, toddler care about \$135. Working parents need help with childcare costs. Please pray for all children at risk and watch the bulletin next week for more information about our Diocesan advocacy initiative on behalf of children.

FAITH FORMATION/YOUTH MINISTRY

Dear Church Family,

Today's readings are all wonderful, and therefore I had a difficult time in focusing on just one. Of course, the readings are meant to go together. They were chosen to compliment each other, although I must be honest in saying that sometimes I find the correlation between the readings more difficult to comprehend. But not so today. For me, these readings all seem to flow so marvelously together. For example, the first reading from Isaiah boldly portrays our relationship with God as that of true love. *"You shall be called 'My Delight,' and your land 'Espoused.'"* It certainly is a beautiful image.

The second reading further goes on to describe the gifts we receive by living in God's love. God has bestowed upon each of us distinct talents and characteristics. It's up to us to decipher what those gifts are and to use them for building up God's kingdom on earth. This is a great reading to meditate upon, and in doing so to ask for God's guidance in discerning how our gifts can best be used.

Finally, today's gospel reading tells us of the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. The miracle at the wedding feast of Cana (notice the nuptial connections between the first reading and the gospel) is the first of Jesus' miracles. What I so love about this story is how Mary was able to talk Jesus into this, even though he said, *"My hour has not yet come."* But Mary pressed on, and knowing who her son truly was said to the servants, *"Do whatever he tells you."* This is always the part of this story that fascinates me. I know it goes on to tell us about how not only did Jesus turn the water into wine, but it was the best quality that could be had. But it's the relationship between Jesus and his mother that stands out for me. And that's precisely what all these readings today are about. Relationships. Our loving relationship with God. How the gifts God has given us can build up that relationship, and finally how even our personal relationships (like that of a mother and son) can lead to the fulfillment of God's promises.

It's a wonderful place to be...in a loving relationship with God. May it always be so for us all. Love, Jeanette
