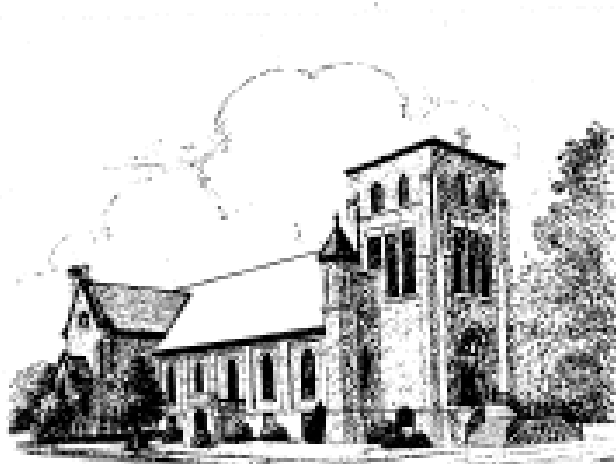

Dear Church Family,

This week celebrates the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time, but our readings are far from ordinary! They are filled with Good News, and hope and purpose. They encourage us to recognize the gifts that God gave us, and to use them to "reveal God's glory." I find this to be especially appropriate as we are still at the beginning of 2010, which makes this a wonderful time for discernment—to sit back, examine ourselves and decide where our gifts can best be used to evangelize.

Okay, here's where I'm going. Firstly, I know of a few people who don't like the word "discernment." But I believe it best fits the point I'm trying to make. To discern means much more than just deciding or thinking about something. It's a way of making things more clear—distinguishing them, better understanding what it is we're trying to figure out. Secondly, we are called through our Baptism to spread the Good News of God—to *evangelize*, but I also know some people that don't like that word either. Or maybe it's just the concept they don't like. Let's face it, most Catholics were not raised to "evangelize." Or were we? The definition of evangelization means to convert somebody...to persuade them, to enthusiastically advocate for a cause. Well guess what? There are MANY people in our church community that do that everyday! Maybe they've discerned where their gifts lie, or maybe they just help where they are comfortable...but that's usually at something we're good at.

Here's the people in our community that I see as evangelizers...the women of the Martha Ministry who prepare and serve meals after funerals. Our Stephen Ministers who spend time one-on-one with someone in need. The members of our Social Ministry Committee, and the Parish and Finance Councils. What about our lectors, commentators, altar servers, and Eucharistic Ministers? Oh, and then there are the volunteer Catechists and Children's Liturgy planners. Let's see, there are the ushers and greeters, oh yea...and those who plan, direct, and run the Parish Festival. Hey, I can't forget those that organize the Christmas Bazaar. And then there are those that so lovingly grace us with their musical talent. There are the women in the Rosary and Altar Society. Those who run the Rummage Sale; there are the decorators of the church...and those that maybe can't get out, but are involved in the prayer Network (hey, everyone can pray). Our community donates to (and helps coordinate) the local Food Closet. And do you know how incredibly generous the donations were for this year's Advent Giving tree? We even have a volunteer Liturgist at our Parish Office!

I hope you get my point...because we all have to start somewhere. Even Jesus had to be encouraged by his Mother to share his gifts at the Wedding Feast at Cana! So I'm encouraging you, too. And you can simply do your part by living for God. That really is the best way to evangelize—living our lives for God. If we do that, our children will learn by our example, and they, too, will grow to share the importance of God's everlasting love. That, my friends, is how we will keep this community going and growing. It's all up to you...so spend a bit of time in discernment this week, and use those precious God-given gifts to spread the Good News of Jesus!
