**Reflection Questions:** [Mk 6: 30-44] After a busy day, how do you like to unwind? How do you react when you are faced with an overwhelming sense of need? How has Jesus fed you when you have been spiritually hungry lately?

[Mk 6:45-55] Where are you "straining at the oars?" How do Jesus' words speak to that storm?

**¿Sabes Algo de San Francisco de Sales?**

San Francisco de Sales, quien celebramos el 24 de enero, es el patrón de la iglesia donde tenemos la Misa en español en Geneva, y pensé, después de compartir con los de Geneva, que quizás ustedes les gustaría saber algo de él. Francisco de Sales, el mayor de 13, nació en 1567 a una familia de nobleza de Saboya. De sus padres recibió el testimonio de la caridad con los necesitados, al igual que el amor de Dios. Desde temprana edad Francisco sentía la llamada de Dios a la vida consagrada. Su padre quería que él estudiara las leyes pero él quería estudiar la teología, por eso estudió los dos consiguiendo el título de doctor en derecho civil y canónico. Francisco no aceptó el cargo de senador ofrecido a él, y manifestó su intención de ser un sacerdote. Eventualmente fue ordenado y nombrado obispo de Ginebra, un centro de los Calvinistas. El predicaba y distribuía panfletos que él escribía explicando la doctrina Católica. Por estos y libros de espiritualidad que él escribió, él es consideraba el patrón de los periodistas.

Junto con Juana de Chantal Francisco fundó la orden religiosa de la Visitación de Santa María cuya misión fue: ayudar a los pobres y socorrer las miserias humanas y posibilitar a toda alma alcanzar la perfección del amor divino. No se puede amar a Dios, sino se ama al prójimo.

Después de dominar su enojo Francisco fue un modelo ejemplar de las virtudes de dulzura, bondad, amabilidad, mansedumbre, amor y humildad. Francisco dijo: "Sed siempre lo mas amable que puedan, porque se recogen más moscas con una cucharada de miel, que con cien barriles de vinagre. Si es preciso caer en algún extremo, que sea en el de la dulzura."

Tendríamos un cambio en la familia y la comunidad si viviéramos lo que él escribió: "No nos enojemos en el camino unos contra otros; caminemos con nuestros hermanos y compañeros con dulzura, paz y amor; y te lo digo con toda claridad y sin excepción alguna: no te enojas jamás, si es posible; por ningún pretexto des en tu corazón entrada al enojo." Todo esto nos da mucho para reflexionar.

Dear Church Family,

This week I started my next to last class at St. Bernard's. By May I will finally be certified in Religious Education, and it will have only taken me 8 years! Although my class taking has been sporadic, I've found that whatever class I'm taking at any particular time seems to be just what I need. And this class on Sacraments and the Church is no exception! It's being taught by Dr. David Stosur. He's a relatively new addition to the faculty at St. Bernard's, and is an excellent teacher. I find him both challenging and extremely well-informed.

Now, being a life long Catholic, and teaching sacramental preparation classes for nearly a decade should certainly qualify me to know a thing or two about sacraments and liturgy. But taking classes such as this readily humbles me into realizing there is always more to learn. This class in particular is allowing me to broaden my existing knowledge with some great insights and new information. To be specific, last week's class covered Liturgical symbol and Christian identity, and what that means from a contemporary Catholic perspective. The reason I'm sharing this with you is because I think it easily correlates with today's scripture readings. How? Let me explain.

Today's gospel reading from St. John marks our return back to Ordinary Time in our Church calendar...it also reminds us of our call to follow Jesus in all we do:

*"Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi' — which translated means Teacher —, 'where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.'" John 1:36-39*

What are you looking for? In all that we do, in every circumstance of our lives, we seem to be continually searching for something. We seek by asking questions, by reading books, and even by taking classes. We do a multitude of "things" in our search—yet most of us don't even know what it is we seek. So I ask you again, what are you looking for? I believe that we are all in search of a deeper meaning to life. And how do we find that? We follow the call of Jesus, *"Come, and you will see."* It is through the sacraments that we are called (Baptism) and through the sacraments and liturgy that we find what we're searching for. Our search is what allows us to grow and what forms our faith. The goal of our formation is to be transformed by Christ. This best happens through scripture, liturgy and sacraments.

Pope Paul the VI's *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* (one of the most well known of the Vatican II Documents) states: *"7. ...Christ is always present in his church, especially in liturgical celebrations. He is present in the sacrifice of the Mass both in the person of the minister...and most of all in the Eucharistic species. ...He is present in his word...he is present when the church prays and sings ...Christ, indeed, always associates the church with himself. ...In the liturgy, by means of signs perceptible to the senses, human sanctification is signified and brought about in ways proper to each of these signs; in the liturgy the whole public worship is performed by the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, that is, by the Head and his members."* - In case you weren't sure...that means us folks! We are the body of Christ! And it's through the liturgy and our worship of the Divine—that WE (all of us) find human sanctification—the answer to our search. With our continued participation in the liturgy and sacraments we grow closer to God. THAT is what we seek—and isn't it amazing?!! Have a great week.
