SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

The gospel text today is significant for us verse 15 states: *"The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."* Commentators suggest that Mark has boiled down his entire gospel to this verse. Time here is God's time and in Jesus God's time has come to fullness. We all find ourselves waiting for God's time to be fulfilled, Mark suggests here that we may be looking in the wrong place, that fulfillment has come in Jesus. He goes on to summarize Jesus preaching in three words, near, repent, believe. God has drawn near. I said in last weeks homily that I often just long for that sense of God's presence. I imagine that many of us find ourselves longing, looking for that sense of God's presence. Again Mark is pulling me up short here, in Jesus, present in the Eucharist both on the altar at Mass, in communion received and reserved in the Tabernacle God has drawn near. God's nearness will often remind us of our need for healing and forgiveness. Thus repent my sin, yes. But, repent as well my failure to give myself to Him, my self centeredness. Repent the ways that I have not attended to His Word in my life. I would have no need of repenting if I had no intention of believing. Believe, the gospels are all about deepening belief in the heart of the reader. Mark in this gospel is proclaiming a news which has turned his life upside down. That is mirrored in the reaction of Peter and Andrew in the scene that follows. Jesus walks past them and then drop everything and follow Him. Their response is out of their belief. This gospel proclaimed today and throughout the year to come means to deepen in us belief in our God whose time is fulfilled in Jesus, who has drawn near to us and abides with us always.

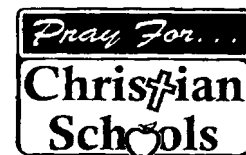
YOUTH...
