Dear Church Family,

I've said it before, and now I'm saying it again—but it always amazes me how the Holy Spirit is at work. Let me explain...

Today as I sat down to write this I was feeling a bit gloomy. That's the only adjective I could come up with to describe my mood. There are several reasons I've been feeling this way. I've been under the weather for the last few days. I have laryngitis—and I literally haven't been able to talk! Okay, for my co-workers this is not a bad thing—but for me...well let's just say it's not fun. Also, I had to have my 13 year old cat put down last Friday. Some of you may empathize with me over this, and some of you might not get it, but that was a really hard decision to make, and a terrible thing to have to do. And what is it about this time of year? Is it just me, or does the cold and darkness get to some of you too? I long for Spring, and the flowers, birds and longer days it brings. Ah, but it is January after all, and with that comes the short days and cold nights, so I tell myself to just make the best of it. Then I sit down to with this week's readings and right off the bat (in the first reading from Isaiah) this is what I see, *"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shown."* That's just freaky!! Here I am feeling bleak—and sad—and that's what I read. I honestly almost started crying out of happiness, not sadness, because the insight that God was there hit me like a ton of bricks! Is it arrogant to think that God acknowledges and helps with even my miniscule problems? No, it's appropriate to think that, because God is there for us even in our simple struggles—just as he is there in our greater ones.

One thing I've learned over the course of my faith journey is to be open to God's communications with me. We've all experienced this—I call them my guardian angel moments. Maybe it's something as simple as a favorite song playing on the radio, or a friend calling or emailing out of the blue when you really needed to hear from them. Sometimes it's a beautiful sunset, or a birdsong. Maybe it's your teenager telling you they love you (for no reason!). Maybe it's your dog or cat curled up in your lap on a cold winter's night. Maybe it's getting a hug or just getting smiled at. Maybe it's understanding that we belong to a faith community that supports and loves one another. But don't kid yourself into thinking these "things" are just coincidences. No, these "things" are God. And God is there—always, because as this week's Psalm so eloquently states, *"The Lord is my light and my salvation."*

Hey, I just realized something—I'm in a better mood! God must be trying to tell me something.
