CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK

Today we begin our annual celebration of Catholic Schools and specifically our St. Michael's.

FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

Today's Gospel from St. Mark marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry with his teaching in the Synagogue. He came to this world for a very specific reason – to proclaim the Good News and to grant us salvation (healing) through God's love. In today's reading he does exactly that. Not only does he teach "with a new authority," which is to say he spoke on his own behalf, but he also heals a man filled with evil spirits. He spread the Good News with words and action. We, as Christians, are to do the same. How? Well, this past week in our Jr. High Youth Group (KFC – Kids For Christ) gathering, we spent a lot of discussion time on the Corporal and Spiritual works of mercy, which are terrific guidelines on sharing our faith. I started off the discussion explaining the definition of *MERCY: A virtue (good quality) that influences us to have compassion for, and lessen another's misfortune.* I further explained that Corporal refers to bodily necessities, and Spiritual refers to saintly or devout necessities. Here are some of the ways the kids interpreted we can live out these mercies now.

1. **Feed the hungry** ~ Make food for our neighbors. ~ Volunteer at the Free Lunch Program. ~ Donate and collect food for the Food Closet.
 2. **Give drink to the thirsty** ~ Again...donate time and energy by collecting for the Food Closet. ~ Donate to the Red Cross.
 3. **Clothe the naked** ~ *Donate our unwanted clothes to the Salvation Army, or other charities.* ~ *Buy clothes for those in need.*
 4. **Visit the imprisoned** ~ *Join a jail ministry.* ~ *Go to a jail and visit, pray and sing with them.*
 5. **Shelter the homeless** ~ *Volunteer to work at a woman's shelter.* ~ *House someone in your home.* ~ *Pay for a hotel room.* ~ *Help them find a home they can afford.*
 6. **Visit the sick** ~ *Go visit someone in a hospital or nursing home.* ~ *Bring someone flowers.* ~ *Pray for someone who is sick.* ~ *Go caroling at a nursing home.*
 7. **Bury the dead** ~ this was a tough one, as some of the kids had recently lost loved ones, but they had great insight: ~ *Pray for the dead.* ~ *Have a respectful funeral.* ~ *Place tombstones on the graves for remembrance.* ~ *Honor their memory.*

1. **Admonish the Sinner** ~ *Help others realize their mistakes.* ~ *Change someone's opinion on life.* ~ *Lead the way for others.* ~ *Tell someone right from wrong.* ~ *Set examples.* ~ *Point out bad behaviors*
 2. **Instruct the ignorant** ~ *Teach and talk to others about God.* ~ *Bring or invite someone to church.* ~ *Treat others with respect.*
 3. **Counsel the Doubtful** ~ *Teach them how to pray.* ~ *Take them to church.* ~ *Read them the Bible.* ~ *Witness to them.*
 4. **Comfort the sorrowful** ~ *Pray with them.* ~ *Baby sit or help them in any way you can.* ~ *Talk to them.*
 5. **Bear wrongs patiently** ~ *Calm down and count to 10.* ~ *Forgive others.* ~ *Say, "I'm sorry."*
 6. **Forgive all injuries** ~ *Pray.* ~ *Go to confession.* ~ *Ask for help.* ~ *Talk about it.* ~ *Go to therapy group.*
 7. **Pray for the living and the dead** ~ *Go to church and pray for others.* ~ *Visit the graves of loved ones.*

So, who says the kids don't get it? Not me...I believe the future is in good hands. May God bless you all with a happy and mercy – filled week. Love, Jeanette
