Dear Church Family,

In today's Gospel from St. Mark, we hear the story of the curing of the paralytic. This was a man of great faith, but imagine the faith his friends must have had! They all grabbed a corner of the blanket, and carried this man to Capernaum, then they made their way through the massive crowds, and finally devised a plan to lower the man through the roof to get him to Jesus! We can all only hope to have friends such as these...better still we should all strive to be a friend like this.

I'm writing this on Valentine's Day, and for me, that brings to mind friendship. We are not all blessed to have actual "valentines", and yet I still consider myself richly blessed with the love of my friends. In reflecting on my life, I have come to see what love truly is to me...and I see it in so many ways. I received a bunch of hugs for Valentine's Day from the 5th graders at SMS (*better than a bunch of flowers any day*). I see and experience the love of my family in too many ways to describe.
