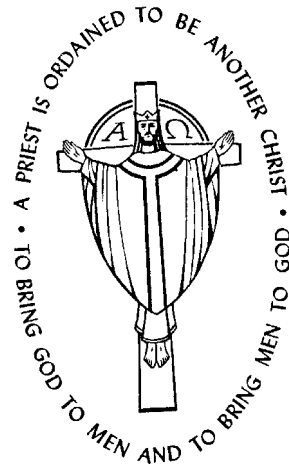

FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

Today is the fourth Sunday of Lent, and with that comes the Gospel reading from St. John that most of us are pretty familiar with. Not many Catholics I know can recite scripture from memory, but I think most of us could recount John 3:16. *"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but have eternal life."* So, we know this passage, and I think it's safe to say we basically understand it, but to grasp the reality of it is almost beyond comprehension. Jesus bestowed upon us the gift of his unconditional love by sacrificing himself in order to grant us —Eternal life! If that doesn't impress upon us just how special we are to God, then I don't know what will. This just reiterates to me the importance of living a good life, and being worthy of the love God has shown us, a love that is described in Psalm 103:11,17 in the following way, *"For as the heavens are high above the earth, so great is his steadfast love. But the steadfast love of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting."*

The Gospel passage from John goes on to tell us that Jesus is the light that has come into the world, and *"whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God."* We are expected to live our lives according to God's will. If Jesus was willing to die for us, is it too much to ask that we live for him?

Here is my Lenten information for this week (which is actually a bit of a review). **What are the three pillars of Lent?** I've mentioned them previously, and they are common enough so that you should know them. Well? *I wish I had another page to give the answer on (you know, like they do in magazines, "go to page...for the answer") but alas, I have to give you the answer here, which probably means you skipped ahead!* The three pillars of Lent are: **Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.** They are pretty basic, and not too difficult to achieve. Simply put, we should pray a bit more, fast from that which has become a barrier between us and God, and give more of ourselves in all that we do. This seems to me to be good advice for any time of the year, not just during Lent. So, in order to help you with the prayer part of this, I would like to share, **I See His Blood Upon the Rose**, which is a favorite of mine by Irish Catholic poet Joseph Mary Plunkett (1887 - 1916).

*I see his blood upon the rose
And in the stars the glory of his eyes,
His body gleams amid eternal snows,
His tears fall from the skies.*

*I see his face in every flower;
The thunder and the singing of the birds
Are but his voice—and carven by his power
Rocks are his written words.*

*All pathways by his feet are worn,
His strong heart stirs the ever-beating sea,
His crown of thorns is twined with every thorn,
His cross is every tree.*
