SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

I invite you to reflect more deeply on the readings of the Fifth Sunday of Lent. *"The days are coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel...I will write it on their hearts; I will be their God and they shall be my people"* Listen to God speaking these words to you and feel Him etching this new law on your heart. We often feel distant from God, perhaps disconnected from Him. Jeremiah reminds us today that God is holding our hearts in His grasp and even writing on them His love. The Hebrews text and the Gospel become even more personal. *"He offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears"* I cannot easily imagine Jesus wrought with the agony of prayer described here. More than not I see Jesus in His glory and focus on His place as Son of God. The author of Hebrews describes His prayer much like many of ours filled with emotion and longing and not particularly certain. I think many of us concentrating on His place as Son of God imagine that He must have known the outcome. This text does not say that at all....loud cries, the author goes on ... *"Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered..."* I do not often think of my suffering as anything else than an oppression. Jesus suffers with me and knows the agonies of our hearts. John in the gospel tells us he said *"Yet what should I say, Father save me from this hour.."* Many of us face just such hours, times when all of life seems to crash in upon us. Jesus is asking just as I do can I avoid this, stop it from happening? His answer comes later in the reading, *"but it was for this hour that I came."* I wonder if I can say that too? Knowing that He walked the same path before me helps. Knowing that He is walking it with me at this moment helps. Knowing that the Father is so close as to even etch His word on my heart that helps too. I invite you to ponder this Word of God during this fifth week of Lent.

Dear Church Family,

"I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour." (John 12:27). In reading over this week's Gospel from St. John, the above phrase kept jumping out at me... **"I am troubled now."** We all know what it's like to suffer. Whether it be physical or emotional, we are a people that often find ourselves "troubled." That isn't always a bad thing, at least some good can come out of it. How? Well, the suffering we experience becomes a part of us, and it enables us to view life in a different way. Recently, I was talking with Pat Albrecht, who told me that being a breast cancer survivor is a part of who she now is. Although she never asked to have cancer, it enabled her to help others who are experiencing similar problems...and to do so with compassion. Likewise, I never thought I'd be a single mother. My life the way I envisioned it would be in my youth...is no more, and so my divorce too has become a part of who I am. When parents come to me explaining why their children can only make it to Faith Formation classes every other week, or may not be able to make sacramental preparation sessions because "it's the week they're with their father or mother," I understand, and am able to do so with compassion. In every bad situation we face, some good will come out of it, of that I am sure. Yes, our troubles become a part of who we are, but through prayer and the grace of God, we get through those troubles, and hopefully are then able to help others as well.

So, now I'll ask you...how is your Lent going? Have you been able to work on some of the "things" that get in the way of your relationship with God? I have honestly been trying, but I still have a lot of work to do. Lent is the starting off point for me, and I hope that the Easter Season will afford me the opportunity to keep moving forward. I'm also going to take advantage of God's wonderful, loving gift of the sacraments. We are so fortunate to be a part of a sacramental church, as it is through the sacraments that we continue to grow and learn of God's amazing grace. How we decide to put this gift to use is up to us. As St. Paul says in his letter to the Romans, **"the love of God is poured forth in our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us."** (Rom. 5:5). Now that truly is Good News!
