What we celebrate as a faith community here at St. Michael's reminds us that all of us are important, that we contribute some unique and wonderful aspect of God's wonderful plan, and that we are most assuredly wanted and loved by our generous God.

The God who walked with the disciples on the road to Emmaus is the same God who walks with us now. He is the God who lives in each and every one of us, and most especially in our young people who have reminded us through their gifts and talents that he still journeys with us and still feeds us in the breaking of the bread.

SOCIAL MINISTRY: Today's readings make clear that the days following Jesus' death were troubling for his disciples. They had believed that Jesus would lead a revolution to overthrow Rome and free Jerusalem. Instead, it seemed as if those in power had won. When Jesus broke bread with them, their hearts filled with insight. They returned to Jerusalem with a new understanding of God's redemptive love, compassion and justice. Bringing that understanding to public life requires us to be guided by moral convictions, rather than attachment to political goals of interests. The US bishops tell us that our actions in the public sphere should be, "focused on the dignity of every human being, the pursuit of the common good, and the protection of the weak and the vulnerable."

Dear Church Family,

Today's gospel reading from St. Luke is the thought provoking story of "The Road to Emmaus." I love this gospel passage, because it's a compelling one, that asks us the following question—Are we able to see Jesus when he is directly in our midst?

Here are some more questions to think about—Where do we see Jesus? How can we seek him out in our everyday lives?

I posed those same questions to our Jr. High Youth Group (KFC) when we met last week. I asked them specifically to think of ways they see or seek out Jesus, and this is what I got:

- By expressing myself in art, music or dance.
- At night I can reflect and thank the Lord for the day.
- By saying a quick prayer— "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."
- Spend time at a loved one's grave and remember the special times we shared.
- Praying before bed, and setting aside special times to pray.
- Just think about him!
- Go to church every Sunday.
- I spend time with Jesus by praying by myself for other people.
- The time that I spend doing nothing—is when I find Jesus.
- I make good choices.
- By praying and going to church.
- By meditating.
- IN PRAYER!

Those are the actual responses I received. I had the kids write them on sticky notes, and then place them on a poster board. Then we discussed their answers.

I don't know about all of you, but I was pretty impressed by their sincere replies. They were pretty creative in how they see Jesus, or how they seek him out.

Here are a couple of my observations to their answers, and from working with them in general:

- It's often *not* the kids that don't want to go to church.
- Some people assume that kids are either doing too much, or they don't do enough...but in either circumstance, they are finding Jesus—in their art, music, dance, and even in their nothing!
- Kids think about and pray for loved ones all the time, and in doing so find Jesus.

Seriously, these kids amaze me. We can only all hope to see Jesus like they do!
