**"Our Most Holy Week"**

As individuals, as families, I urge you to try to take time this week as we commemorate the central events in the life of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Lent ends Holy Thursday afternoon when we move into a separate time known as the "Sacred Triduum (three days)" Each day of the Triduum will begin with Morning Prayer in the church at 9 AM. If possible one or all the days come to open the day with the ancient prayer of the church. The service which includes some singing with spoken parts by the congregation will not be longer than thirty minutes.

Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper will begin at 7:30 PM. It recalls Jesus gathering with his disciples on that night before. During the Mass those willing partake in the foot washing. This ritual act reminds each of us who wash and are washed and who watch too that we are called to serve, just as Jesus who first washed the feet of his disciples. The Mass ends with the Eucharist being processed and reposed. The church is open until midnight for prayer. An ancient custom is to go to three churches for prayer on this night. Bring your family, take time yourself this most holy night. We will conclude at 11:45 PM with Night Prayer.

Good Friday begins again with prayer at 9. At Noon our Spanish community gathers in the Hall for the Stations. At the same time the Ecumenical Good Friday Service begins at St. Mark's Church and will process to several churches through 3 PM. The Solemn Service of the Lord's Passion at St. Michael's will begin at 2:00 PM. This ancient service which includes the reading of the John Passion, the Veneration of the Cross and the reception of Communion will take about an hour. It is solemn in every respect and charged with symbol and meaning as we remember Jesus death and burial. Good Friday will conclude with the Living Stations presented by members of our Youth Group at 7:30 PM. If you have never been you must consider time for this very moving presentation of the Passion of Jesus. Holy Saturday opens with Prayer at 9 then we wait as a community until dark (8:30 PM) to begin the Vigil of Easter wherein the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation will be celebrated with our Elect, Heather. This is perhaps the oldest of the Holy Week liturgies and the one which is most moving if you have never been you will not be disappointed. The Eucharist of Easter will be celebrated at 7 AM, 8:15 and 10:30 AM. The music will be full of joy, we will renew our Baptism, which we have spent these Lenten days preparing and rejoice in the Light and Life of Christ. Invite a friend to come with you to Easter Mass or the whole of Holy Week as we bask in the Grace of these days. Have a wonderful and blessed week.

## FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

This past Sunday was the final session for the 14 candidates preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. We've been preparing along with 37 other candidates from St. Patrick's, Macedon, and St. Anne's / St. Gregory's, Palmyra / Marion. This is always a wonderful experience, and the retreat on Sunday was no exception. Assumption Church in Fairport generously provided us with the use of their facilities for the day, which was a long one. We began at 2:00 p.m. and headed home around 8:30 p.m. This is my fourth time planning such a retreat, and though there are always glitches, there are always moments of awe as well. The high point of the day was attending the Life Teen Mass there (which takes place every Sunday at 6:00 p.m.). What an amazing experience for us all! The Mass was filled with young people, who participated fully in every aspect of the Liturgy. The music was inspiring (and loud...so the kids enjoyed that part). After the Mass, our young people were invited to join the youth group there for some discussion time. I sat in the back of the room, and simply observed. Because our kids were with other young people they didn't really know, they were better able to share...and they did. I was so proud of them. I know I've said this before, but the future of our Church is in good hands. I was actually a bit discouraged because of the small number of candidates this year. However, working with these young people quickly alleviated that discouragement. I see the Holy Spirit at work in so many of them, and through the graces this wonderful sacrament will afford them, they will only grow stronger in their faith. I've told them the key is being open to that spirit. That's good advice for us as well. The Holy Spirit works in us and through us daily, we only need look for it. How blessed we are. So I ask you to pray for these young people, who are just beginning their journey of faith.



Well, here we are...Palm Sunday. The beginning of the most holy week of the Church year. Like everything else in life, Lent went by very quickly. BUT, it isn't actually over until Holy Thursday. Then begins the Easter Triduum (which means three days). The Triduum consists of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, the three days we commemorate the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. It takes forty days of preparation, for three days of experience, to lead us to fifty days of celebration (the Easter season). This is the "culmination of the entire liturgical year," the essence of our faith. Because Jesus died and was resurrected...we live!

Make your culmination of Lent an eventful and prayerful one!
