I made my commitment on April 12, 1988. It was a wonderful ceremony at Notre Dame Retreat House at the closing Mass of a Day of Prayer for Women. I was often a presenter for those days. It was a wonderful time of life for me.

Now, as of April 12, 2008 – I celebrate 20 years as an Associate . I would love to talk with anyone who might be interested in knowing more about what being a MERCY Associate means.

Just a little information about what a MERCY associate is- we are women and men who have heard God's call – as I put it in my life – to something more. I wanted a deeper connection to my faith and spirituality and people to share that with. That's when I talked with a friend and learned about Association.

There is an application and a discernment process that usually takes about a year. It is a time of learning about MERCY and our founder Catherine McAuley.

The year is also a time of prayer and conversation. It's truly a time to listen to our God and hear whether it is in fact a call to MERCY Association that one is hearing. Our commitments as Associates currently are renewable annually.

In my years as Director of Associates, I traveled to California, Rhode Island, Pennsylvania, Connecticut and Albany to list just a few places to talk about MERCY Association. Many of those engagements planted a seed that grew into Association for their Congregations based on Association as it is experienced in MERCY Rochester,

One special story, I had spoken at a Franciscan Sisters Chapter (meeting) and about 2 days after I spoke I received a call from them sharing with me that they had voted to begin to offer a form of Association with their Congregation based on what I had shared with them.

All of this is the long way of inviting you to think about Association, bring it to prayer and contact me or Sister Kay Schwenzer if you would like more information or just to chat about MERCY Association. It is very much a part of my heart and who I am today.

Dear Church Family,

Last Saturday (April 5) was our Confirmation Retreat at Notre Dame Retreat House in Canandaigua. What a wonderful day it was—and filled with the Holy Spirit.

This year St. Michael's has 28 candidates preparing for confirmation. The Diocesan requirements for sacramental preparation is to be based on the "readiness" of a candidate, not age. And our group reflected that, as we had candidates as young as 10, along with middle school aged participants, a few older teens, and two adults! It's a wonderful group, and Saturday afforded us all the opportunity to learn a little more about our faith through sharing, prayer, scripture, and activities. The day came to a marvelous completion as we celebrated Mass together.

I find retreat days like this to be essential in confirmation preparation. However, technically retreats are no longer required, but everything we covered is mandated through our Diocesan sacramental guidelines—and can be done in separate gatherings, or all together in a day such as this. As for myself, I think that retreat days are a much better (and more personal way) to cover the preparation material. And when we're blessed enough to be placed in a beautiful setting next to Canandaigua Lake—it makes it all the better!

We had a gorgeous sunny day, and the hospitality of the Retreat House staff was exceptional. This is the first retreat I've run, where I didn't have to prepare food and clean up in addition to presenting. I was able to better spend my time with the candidates and sponsors, and it was a joy to do so!

There was a men's retreat that was taking place at the same time we were there. Fr. Barrett (the Retreat House Rector) told us that seeing all the young people so involved in their faith was inspiring to the men. It was inspiring to me as well—right from the beginning of the day when I asked the candidates introduce their sponsors, and share why they had chosen that person. Well, there were a few tears, but all of them were shed in happiness and humility at being a part of such an important faith experience. Every year there are amazing people sponsoring our candidates, and this year was no exception! I am here to tell you all that *our Church is alive and well!* We are thriving in so many ways, and I feel privileged to be able to be a part of that. You all should too! Believe me, much of the success of the day came from all the prayers that were being said (I asked A LOT of people to pray for us), and it was worth everyone's effort! Thank you all for that. Please continue to keep our confirmation candidates, sponsors, and our entire church community in your prayers. I firmly believe prayer makes a difference, which reminds me of these words from St. Francis of Assisi, "Preach the gospel always, if necessary use words." And also, this simple (but poignant) passage from scripture, "Pray without ceasing." (1Thes 5:17).
