 PARISH PASTORAL & FINANCE
 COUNCILS**

This June there will be openings for the Pastoral Council and the Finance Council. For the next two weekends I will invite you during Mass to look around the congregation and name candidates who you believe would be good members of these leadership groups.

Duties for the Parish Pastoral Council

- Give advice and council to the Pastor regarding the pastoral leadership of the parish
- Be willing to listen to and seek out the concerns of one's fellow parishioners regarding our life together as a parish
- Meet with the Pastoral Council the first Tuesday of each month September through June
- Possibly serve on other parish committees or special groups as needed
- Serve a term of three years
- Has received the Sacrament of Confirmation, attends church regularly and is committed to the life of the parish and the greater Church.

Duties of the Parish Finance Council:

- Give advice and council to the Pastor regarding the administration and fiscal oversight of the parish.
- Have a familiarity with the general principles of accounting, fiscal management, issues of investment etc.
- Be willing to work with special projects regarding the administrative care of our parish.
- Meet with the Finance Council on the last Tuesday of the month September through June
- Serve a term not less than three years
- Has received the Sacrament of Confirmation, attends church regularly and is committed to the life of the parish and the greater Church.

Please begin to pray and consider members of the parish community who fit this description and who you believe would serve the community well on one of these councils. There will be slips of paper in the pew during the next two weekends and I will invite you to use those and return your nominations. All candidates will be contacted to determine their willingness to serve. On Pentecost Sunday during each Mass we will seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit and in prayer select new members of our Pastoral and Finance Councils.

PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

The Pastoral Council has begun a process to develop a parish mission statement. Your participation in that is essential. In today's bulletin you will find a survey seeking that participation. The survey seeks to measure your sense of our parishes purposes and ministries. Please take time this week to look this over and complete it. You may return these in the collection or directly to the parish office. Additional surveys will be in church next weekend and can be completed at that time.

FIRST EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

Last week at the Cathedral we celebrated Confirmation and next weekend we will celebrate First Eucharist. Our church lives out of a sacramental principle. Everything can mediate the presence and activity of God, yet we focus on seven special moments when we realize God's Grace. These are not graduations. Each sacramental moment is meant to call us to deeper conversion. Our whole lives are about deeper conversion to Jesus and gospel living. Too often we treat these celebrations as graduation ceremonies. Too often gaps develop between one sacrament and another. I invite all of us to reflect during these Easter days on our ongoing conversion. Such reflection ought to lead us deeper into the Sacraments we celebrate with the church community and deeper into the living of the gospel in our schools, homes and places of work. The sacraments are not coupons we receive. They developed through the ancient communities experience of the presence of the Risen Christ in their midst in the breaking of the bread and these other particular moments marriage, confirmation, reconciliation, in illness. The sacraments recognize that Jesus has not left us alone but abides in all times and places. Have a good week. Love, Fr. Peter

FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

As we enter into May, I would like to remind you that this month is dedicated to our Blessed Mother, and as such I would like to share one of my favorite Biblical passages. It is found in Luke, and takes place as Mary is visiting her cousin Elizabeth, directly after the annunciation (*the angel announces that Mary is to be the mother of our Lord*). Upon Elizabeth's greeting, Mary proclaims the following, commonly known as the **Magnificat**, which is a Latin word derived from the Greek meaning to celebrate the greatness of God.

And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden. For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. And his mercy is on those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm, he has scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts, he has put down the mighty from their thrones, and exalted those of low degree; he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent empty away. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his posterity for ever." (Luke 1:46-55)

Below is a list of other places in scripture where you can find important events in the life of Mary, specifically when Mary is interacting with Jesus. This is the perfect time of year to spend some time in prayer, asking our Blessed Mother to pray for us all, and to intercede on our behalf to our Heavenly Father.  - Jesus is raised from the dead. (Mt 28:1-10)
