SOME THINGS CONSIDERED...

The Work of the Spirit

This Feast of Pentecost set me thinking this week about the Spirit's movement in our midst. A couple of weeks ago I noticed a young man in church whom I had not seen before. Last week he came up to me after mass. He introduced himself and asked about beginning the RCIA (the process by which persons enter the church). In further conversation he said that while baptized in another church he felt increasingly drawn to the Catholic Church. The times I have seen him in church his attention and participation has been noticeable, something is clearly happening here, *the work of the Spirit*. Our parish is blessed with several men and women who make themselves available for others in need. Our Stephen Ministers accept assignments of persons who seek a caring, Christian friend willing to listen and spend time. These ministers are a quiet and little seen blessing for so many in our midst, *the work of the Spirit*. I am currently reading a wonderful book, A Church in Search of Itself, Robert Blair Kaiser. Fr. Simeon Gallagher recommended it to me. Kaiser analyzes the time around the death of John Paul and the election of Benedict. He does so through the stories of six of the cardinals who would participate in the election. They are from around the globe and the description of them and the communities they serve has been inspiring. I can easily focus on things both religious and secular from the viewpoint of the west and here in the US. Kaiser's has given me a sense of the church, its work and life in Africa, South America, Asia as well as Europe and the US. It is inspiring and challenging on many levels for me, *the work of the Spirit*. We are coming up on the festival. Many score of people will work so hard this week. Many more will come into our midst and enjoy themselves and God willing be blessed by our service in this immense project, *the work of the Spirit*. The tongues of fire described in Acts were not momentary. God's Spirit hovers today in your life, mine, our community our church. At times you may need to look more carefully for the light and its effects. With just a little effort you will see all around you and within you the *work of the Spirit*. At masses this weekend we will select new members of our Pastoral and Finance Councils. Nearly thirty were nominated for the Pastoral Council and more than fifteen for the Finance Council. Our community is richly gifted with good, generous and talented persons, *the work of the Spirit*. I look forward to seeing you at the Festival and perhaps having time for conversation that coming and going from Church does not allow for. Have a great week. Love, Fr. Peter

FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

Today we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, and with that comes the end of the Easter Season. The first reading from St. Luke (Acts 2:1-11) describes the event in which the Holy Spirit descends upon the Apostles, enabling them to proclaim! This occurrence is depicted as happening in a very dramatic way...loud noises, strong wind, and tongues of fire! I personally don't know how well I would have handled that situation! But I do know that we all rely on the Holy Spirit in so many ways, yet it often takes a back seat. I say this because we focus so on Jesus and God in prayer, that the Holy Spirit can be pushed aside. Yet, as Catholics, every time we pray the Sign of the Cross we are invoking the Holy Spirit. And a good thing too. The Holy Spirit imparts on us graces we receive nowhere else. In all seven sacraments of the Church, we ask the Holy Spirit's blessing. Specifically in baptism and in confirmation, where we are blessed with the words, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

When something unexpectedly happy happens, I've often heard some of the older members of our church family say, "The Holy Spirit was at work!" Since I've been preparing candidates for the sacrament of confirmation, I too find myself saying the same thing! I look upon the Holy Spirit with awe, and mystery, and that's the great thing about faith. You don't have to understand everything about it, you just have to believe. And I believe that the Holy Spirit is at work in every one of us!

I read that in Greek the word for 'breath' and 'spirit' are the same. How amazing is that? To me, that means that every time I take a breath, I'm receiving the Holy Spirit! Yep, that's the way I'm going to look at it, and I have to be very grateful that the Holy Spirit resides in each of us. If we put it to good use, who knows what we can accomplish!

So, I will leave you with one of my favorite prayers of the Holy Spirit (there are many—look them up sometime!). I hope you all have a wonderful Spirit-filled week! Love, Jeanette
