There are so many people encompassed in the above that I could not begin to list the names. I wrote in last weeks column the Festival Committee leaders and they deserve a special round of applause. However, the Festival is yours, it is the whole parish festival and it works because so many of you work at it. The final numbers are not yet in, however the car alone will bring nearly \$20,000 profit so it all went very well despite the weather. When all the bills are paid we will give a final number. The total gross income is: \$66,579.

Last week and this our liturgy calls our attention to two Solemn Feasts the Blessed Trinity and The Body and Blood of Christ. Both feasts come from the same time The Body and Blood of Christ was first established in 1246 by Pope Urban IV and The Trinity by Pope John XXII in 1334. In many respects they have a similar focus, that of God's love. Trinity celebrates our sense that God exists as a communion of persons, one and three. Father, Son and Spirit while three are worshiped and known as one. There three ness signals us of the communion of love that we know as God. So too in the Eucharist. The image has been used that Eucharist is the kiss of God upon humankind. In His Body and Blood we are physically made one with Jesus and in Jesus with the Father and the Spirit. So many of us struggle to sense and find God in our lives. In His Body and Blood Jesus touches us, abides with us, remains with us as he promised in John's Gospel. In his Body and Blood Jesus embraces us as a mother embraces her fearful child.

FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. This feast is very important to what we as Catholics believe regarding the "real presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. Unfortunately, many of us don't realize how central to our faith this belief is. Guess what? Our First Communion children get it. They understand what I teach them, and because they still are at a stage in their lives where they are accepting and open to new ideas, they take me at my word. I tell them how important each of the seven sacraments are to our faith, but that in the Eucharist they will actually receive Jesus -JESUS IS PRESENT! Now really, how cool is that! That's why most of them are so very excited to take this important step. Yet, as we grow older, we also often grow more cynical. Why do we lose that child-like faith? Because life can be tough, and it can be easy to do. We can become immune to the excitement and joy we felt as a child. Well, I believe there's still some child left in even the most skeptical among us! I will do my part here, and to help you better understand the teaching of the Church on this, I'm including some quotes from the **Catechism of the Catholic Church**.

1373 "Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us," is present in many ways to his Church: in his word, in his Church's prayer, "where two or three are gathered in my name, "in the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, in the sacraments of which he is the author, in the sacrifice of the Mass, and in the person of the minister. But "he is present . . . most especially in the Eucharistic species." 1374 The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as "the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend." In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained."

I really like that last line... "Christ is **truly, really, and substantially** contained." There it is, in black and white, and I hope in our hearts as well. This is why we bow before receiving communion, because we are showing our reverence to Jesus. This is why we visit Jesus during Eucharistic Adoration. Let's always continue to remember how important this belief is to our faith.

I leave you with an "old time" Eucharistic prayer to be said after receiving communion.
