A few years ago when the house was purchased and being renovated our youth group and some of our parishioners helped with their renovation. There is still *much* need there. Last week when parishioners visited the house, it was evident they needed food. In an effort to help stock their pantry, please bring staple food, canned goods, cereal, box or canned drinks/juice, beans, rice, soap, personal hygiene products, paper products, etc. next weekend. If you wonder what to bring - anything that you might find in your own pantry or bathroom would be the type of things needed. There is also a need for bath towels, wash cloths and fans.

FAITH FORMATION/YOUTH MINISTRY

Dear Church Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Birth of St. John the Baptist. I did quite a bit of research on him as I was putting together the Children's Liturgy worksheets, and although I pretty much had the story down, I found a few new interesting facts. For example, today's feast day is exactly 6 months before Christmas Eve, because it was referenced in St. Luke's gospel that when Mary visited Elizabeth, *upon learning that she was to be the Mother of Jesus*, Elizabeth was already 6 months pregnant. At that time she was many years barren and her husband Zechariah was considered an old man. Yet, the angel Gabriel (*the same angel that visited Mary*) proclaimed to Zechariah that he and Elizabeth were to be blessed with a son. Though a man of great faith, Zechariah didn't believe Gabriel's message, and was rendered speechless until the birth of his child. Because this feast is always celebrated on the 24th of June, it only falls on a Sunday every 7 years. As such, we don't get much of a chance to hear or learn about the extraordinary life of John the Baptist. He was born to make a way for the Lord, and to preach the repentance of sin (*a note worthy concept in this day and age*). As he grew, he became the first person to recognize Jesus as the Messiah, later baptizing him in the Jordan River, which in turn began Jesus' public ministry. What a story! And it only gets more interesting (*as John was eventually beheaded*) ~ wow, who says the Bible isn't filled with great stories! If you have kids, invite them to spend a little time on the internet, or in the library looking up some information about this great Saint. And if you don't have children, then why not spend time doing some research yourself. I have a feeling this fascinating story will keep you riveted!

The following prayer is dedicated to St. John the Baptist:

**Almighty God,
by whose providence your servant John the Baptist was wonderfully born, and sent to prepare the way of your Son our Savior by preaching repentance: Make us so to follow his teaching and holy life, that we may truly repent according to his preaching; and, following his example, constantly speak the truth, boldly rebuke that which is unjust, and patiently suffer for the truth's sake; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.**

Amen.

Have a wonderful week...and as for saying good bye to Fr. Peter, well that's just not going to happen. Instead I say: *Best wishes, good luck and may God continually bless you on your journey—we'll all miss you!*
