SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

With this Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time we rejoin the reading of Mark's gospel at the fourth chapter. We find Jesus crossing the Sea of Galilee in the midst of a violent storm. The sea and particularly storms at sea is a biblical image of the uncontrolled chaos of the world. The ancient writers reflected the fears of their contemporaries at being powerless over this mighty force. It became for them a metaphor of the many realities in life over which they had no control. This scene in Mark's gospel has become significant in that it prompted an image of the church as a boat. The church is often referred to as the 'bark of Peter', picking up on this sense of the being in a boat. Mark fascinatingly shows Jesus asleep. How familiar is that? I often wonder if He is listening as I storm heaven about this or that need. It can feel as though He is asleep. There is a subtle message in the text where Mark says that Jesus and the disciples are crossing to "the other side". Their destination is outside Jewish territory. Some interpreters have wondered if this text indicates the struggles within the early community around accepting non Jews as members. They wonder if Mark in recalling Jesus going to Gentile territory to preach and teach was not signaling to us of later generations His call to include and welcome. Our current struggles in America around the issues of immigration could be reflected upon in light of this text. Jesus ministry embraces those believed unclean, in a ritual sense illegal and certainly unacceptable. We know that in later years this became a central issue for the early community and in the end caused its final separation from Judaism. Is that what Jesus wanted to have happen? We will not know that until we reach the Kingdom. However this text gives us room to reflect on our own stance on the complicated issues of welcoming the stranger to our midst. While crossing to the other side, with his disciples convulsed in fear he slept in peace. In this and all storms he is with us. Have a great week. Love, Fr. Peter

FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

This Sunday's gospel reading from St. Mark is an exciting story of Jesus calming the storm. This passage has significant meaning in regards to our faith. The story starts out rather simply, as Jesus and the disciples are crossing the Sea of Galilee. Jesus was tired. He was asleep, when suddenly a violent storm approached. The disciples anxiously awakened Jesus, who immediately rebuked the storm (I love that word... rebuked) with, "Quiet! Be still!" The storm calmed, and all was well. BUT...Jesus questioned the faith of his followers. They were "filled with great awe" and wondered who this person (Jesus) could be that the seas obeyed him. Though they were his followers, they didn't understand the magnitude of who he was. Their faith was put to a test. Our faith is often put through the same kind of scrutiny, and we too don't always recognize Jesus.

We all experience storms in life, not necessarily literal ones, but hardships, and tragedies. And don't we often question our faith during those times as well? It's funny, this morning as I was reading over this week's gospel, a sudden torrent of rain came down, along with some thunder and lightning. It truly is amazing to me how God works, as it was through that storm, that I was able to clearly see the direction this letter would take. It is now late afternoon as I write this, and the sky is blue and the sun is shining. That's often how it is in life. As we live the storms, we wonder if the sun will ever shine again. But it does. We weather the storms of our lives with God by our side. You know the old expression, "the calm before the storm"? Well, with God it's really the other way around. He calms the storms of our lives. No matter what may befall us, if we keep our faith, God will see us through. Now that's an amazing message!
