"Hearts are broken." That was the headline for the lead article in the Democrat and Chronicle on Thursday, two days after the horrible accident that took the lives of 5 young women from Fairport. An entire community is devastated by this unexplainable, unforeseeable accident. Lives have been taken from us, lives that were created by God for a purpose. I believe that all of us are created by God for some reason, with some part of God's message within each of us that we are to proclaim to the world. We are to live our lives discovering that message that we are to give to the world and to proclaim it with great joy. I wonder if the messages of these 5 women – Hannah, Bailey, Meredith, Sara, and Katherine – have been silenced...or are they yet to be proclaimed? In their absence, can their messages still be proclaimed to us?

I cannot imagine the experience these families and friends are going through. So great a loss, so deep a wound. We can all tap into our own experience of grief and loss, and gain some insight into their loss. A vast and deep hole has been created in the lives of the families and friends that might never be filled. But our faith calls us to live as people of hope in the face of death and darkness. How do we do that?

I wish to quote the Dutch Catholic Priest, Henri Nouwen. In his book, *In Memoriam*, he writes about the experience and reflection on his own mother's death. He questions what the purpose of her death was for...his own good? So that the Spirit of truth could come to him? Is there a purpose to grieving and mourning?

"To remember her does not mean telling her over and over again to my friends, nor does it mean pictures on the wall or a stone on her grave; it does not even mean constantly thinking about her. No. It means making her a participant in God's ongoing work of redemption by allowing her to dispel in me a little more of my darkness and lead me a little closer to the light. In these weeks of mourning she died in me more and more every day, making it impossible for me to cling to her as my mother. Yet by letting her go I did not lose her. Rather, I found that she is closer to me than ever. In and through the Spirit of Christ, she indeed is becoming part of my very being."

The spirits of these 5 women live on in the hearts that are broken, in the lives that must go on without them. But their message will be proclaimed as their families and friends, as all of us remember that in the brokenness of life, in the bread that is broken for us, new life emerges. Their messages will be proclaimed by the Spirit of Christ that lives on through us, with us and in us. We carry their messages with us, and we must proclaim them. May they rest in the Peace of Christ. Blessings, Fr. Mark

Dear Church Family,

As I write this letter to you today, I can't help but feel a little melancholy, as I had to write this early (because of the holiday next week) and today is Tuesday...the great day of change here at St. Michael's! As Fr. Peter was leaving, Fr. Mark was pretty much coming on in! There's been a lot of crying around here today, and Fr. Mark said he's pretty much been doing the same thing (I think he'll fit in here just fine). Well, here I am sitting here feeling a little blue and then I go over the readings for July 8...oh how I love my faith—and the fact that the holy spirit is at work yet again, because these readings are so full of hope and joy—and are a wonderful reminder of God's *abundant* love!

After meditating on these readings, the word *abundance* kept running through my mind. What a great word! It so adequately describes God's love for us! *Abundant* means *providing a more than plentiful supply of something*. God's love is more than plentiful, yet we can never have too much of it. The great thing is, that's okay, because the supply is endless. How awesome is that?

All three readings today, and even the psalm, reiterate this theme of God's love, and do so beautifully—the first reading from the prophet Isaiah being nearly poetic in its imagery...*"you shall be carried in her arms, and fondled in her lap; as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you."* Now, I ask you, how can anyone feel badly while reading that? Today's psalm too is joyful... *"Let all the earth cry out to God with joy...Blessed be God who refused not my prayer or his kindness!"* God is there for us, answering our prayers, showing us his kindness in so many ways. We just need to open our eyes and look!

What struck me from today's gospel reading was something I can very much relate to today. The disciples excitedly returned from the mission Jesus sent them on, because of its success. But Jesus brought them down a notch by telling them, *"Do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you; but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."* We all can get a little ahead of ourselves when we succeed at something, but our faith teaches us that the ultimate reward is where our true joy lies. And what a reward that will be! Yes, what a gift is our faith—a gift that allows us to comprehend God's love for us and enables us to *abundantly* love our God as well. What more could we ask for?
