SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

In today's gospel Jesus tells his disciples to go on mission while taking only a walking stick with them. As I think about that text I become aware of how much stuff I have. Within the year I will need to pack all this stuff up and move it somewhere. I have everything from books to bibles, kitchen equipment and china even gardening tools. God only knows how many truck loads it will take to haul all this away. A priest friend told me this year that his goal was to pair down his belongings to the trunk and back seat of his car. I am a long way from that goal. Additionally I am not even sure I want to embrace that goal. I have things my grandmother made, china that belonged to my parents, gifts given by many friends. I am not ready to send this to the Rummage Sale, (no offense Esther). But, Jesus is quite clear and direct with his disciples take nothing with you, just a walking stick. He did not want them encumbered in anyway. He wanted their full attention on the mission. My stuff does occupy a portion of my attention, maintaining it, sometimes worrying about it. Jesus purpose was to avoid this problem. We live in a consumerist culture that is constantly telling us that we need more stuff. Your relational life will be so much better if you just have...you will be so much happier if you have...you deserve this today. These messages are sometimes obvious and other times subtle but they have their effect. Stuff takes up a good deal of space in our homes and in our brains. So today's gospel challenges us about how it has displaced the gospel message. We do well to take a hard look at what we have and why we have it, as well as how we use all this stuff. Am I less the disciple Jesus calls me to be because of the stuff I surround myself with? Have I used my money wisely in acquiring this stuff or has it prevented me for doing other far better works? It may be a good time to think about stuff.

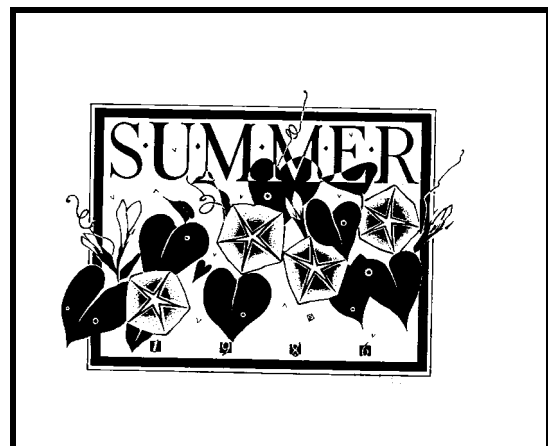
