SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

The Feast of the Transfiguration is assigned to this sixth day of August. Thus once in every seven years we celebrate the feast as the whole community gathers for Sunday Eucharist. The context of this feast is meant to focus our attention on being Jesus' disciple. Our readings of Mark's gospel for the last several weeks have had just that theme. What does it mean to be His disciple? In theology we call this event a 'theophany.' That is an experience of God's presence breaking through our daily life and experience. The disciples on the mountain are overcome, Mark even describes them as terrified. Who wouldn't be terrified in the presence of God? Peter wants to freeze the moment, erect tents and stay there.

Here, one of the key messages of the event comes through. Jesus says no, we cannot stay on this mountain. The 'Transfiguration' was a momentary breakthrough, not a way of life. It will become a way of life when we know the glory of heaven. Now, however, Peter, James and John, as well as all of us, are still on the way. So, Jesus leads them and us back down the mountain. We go back down the mountain to daily life, to our lives as His disciples. That life comes with a cost and a benefit. The benefit is the glory that the transfiguration reveals. The cost is the cross and all it implies. The challenge to Peter and the others that day and ourselves today is are we ready and willing for the cost.

Interestingly, on this day Aug 6, 1890 the electric chair was used for the first time in Auburn, NY. On this day in 1945 the US dropped the first atomic bomb on Hiroshima. These two anniversaries point up the cost in some ways. Jesus calls us beyond the violence of the death penalty and even of war. Yet each of us finds within ourselves these conflicts and so many other issues on occasion. Discipleship requires that we wrestle with these conflicts and sometimes take stands that become very unpopular. This is all part of being His disciple, of attaining his glory. Have a great week. Dear Church Family,

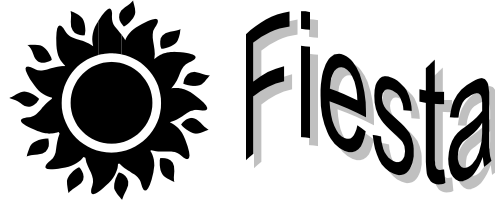
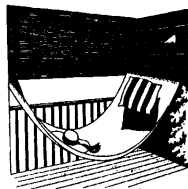
Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration. This story related to us from St. Mark has always been a bit difficult for me to wrap my mind around. Why? Because I don't get how Peter, James and John could have been witness to this extraordinary event, and then keep it to themselves. Okay, I know that Jesus asked them not to speak of it to others, at least until the "Son of Man had risen from the dead," but they didn't even know what that meant...and I can tell you all, had I witnessed Transfiguration first hand, I would have a very difficult time keeping it to myself! Peter, James and John must have conversed about it amongst themselves! How could they not? Well, at least they had each other to talk to, otherwise how could they have kept it to themselves!
