SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

We resume reading the sixth chapter of John today.

Here John meditates on the Eucharist and invites us to do so, as well. The chapter began two Sunday's ago with the miracle of feeding the 5000. This miracle is important as it is the only one which appears in all four Gospel's. This signals us how important this moment in Jesus' life was to the ancient community. Today's gospel text focuses on hunger for wisdom about God.

The recurring image of John is Eucharist as the Bread of Life. This bread feeds the deepest hungers of our spirits not just our bodies. The evidence of such hunger cries out all around us. People flock to preachers and teachers who claim some special knowledge. Books fly off the shelves of Barnes and Noble promising every sort of contentment and fulfillment if one just follows this or that recipe. Folks carry amulets, dangle prisms from their car mirrors, wear bracelets hoping that this or that will bring peace, direction, contentment.

Perhaps Jesus should have chosen something more exotic than bread and wine. Yet there it is free for the taking. Abundant, as in the feeding of the five thousand.

"Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die." Jesus assures us life here and in glory. Not by some secret formula recently discovered, nor by virtue of some trinket. Jesus promises us life through this living bread, blessed and broken and given to us as often as we need. Come, take and eat.

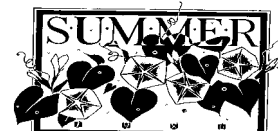

Dear Church Family,

Today's readings are full of advice and "Good News!" These are the kind of readings I like...the ones that I don't have to struggle with. A message comes to me right off the bat, and I just go from there! So, here it is in a nutshell: St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Ephesians, to be "kind, compassionate, and to forgive one another as God has forgiven you in Christ." Great advice. Seems easy to do. It isn't always. Forgiveness is one of those emotions, or should I say virtues, that allows us to forgive wrongs done against us or even someone else. I know this has always been difficult for me. But fortunately for us, we are able to receive help through the sacraments. So, we're given some wonderful advice in this week's readings, and I'm sharing some more with you right here...this is where the sacraments come in.— Please take **every** advantage to attend Mass, receive Eucharist, and be filled with the graces of the Holy Spirit through **all** the sacraments. We are so very blessed to be able to do so!

Please remember to keep us in your prayers as we present Vacation Bible School this week. I'll fill you in on the details next week. Until then, may God bless you all with a wonderful week!
