Dear Church Family,

As I write this letter to you today, my heart is a bit heavy. Many great things have happened to me this week, but I've been discouraged over some of the things that haven't been so great. So, this weeks readings spoke to me in a way they may not normally. That's because on the first look, I was very put off by today's gospel from St. Luke, as it speaks of not peace, but division. I was more drawn to the second reading from St. Paul's letters to the Hebrews. It was easier to relate to, as it gave me a clear message to follow. "Let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us, and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus." The message is clear, and gives us something to aspire to—keeping Jesus in our sight at all times.

But—the gospel reading speaks of division and considering the mood I'm in today that message makes me feel tired! Isn't it so much easier to just live in peace? Yet, to be able to do so requires work on our part, and lets face it, hard work can cause division. Why? Well, I know that personally I can often feel resentful when I work very diligently at something, only to see it not succeed. In last weeks letter I told you all that I rely on my faith in God to know that everything will turn out okay in the end. This week I've had to often repeat that notion to myself. I've prayed, not in the lovingly diligent way that I often do, but more passively. I placed my burdens in God's hands. After all, God certainly knows what's best for us much better than we do ourselves! But the idea of division (especially because of our faith) can be daunting. This division can often be felt where we least expect it. I seem to feel that right now. It's a disappointment that lives deep down in my soul, because recently I've seen first hand a lot of very selfish behavior—and I'm not talking about young people here. Rather, I'm referring to parents—adults that should know better, but don't. People that care more about their own satisfaction than the well-being of their children. I find that incredibly sad, but what saddens me the most is knowing that I at least, have my faith to rely on. I know the despair I'm feeling is fleeting, because God's grace always sees me through! The true sadness of this situation is that most of the adults (I'm referring to) really just don't get it! They don't see the goodness that can come to their lives through faith, and sacraments, and God's loving embrace. They search and search for something, and don't realize that the something they seek is God, and is right there in front of them within their grasp!

So, in my dismay I pray. I pray for the adults I've mentioned, and I pray for their children as well. And I ask you to join in that prayer with me—because everyone needs God. And every young person deserves to be loved in a way that only God can love.

May God bless us all with this knowledge.
