SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

In today's gospel many of Jesus' disciples react to his words. This is too much for us, they say. Several can listen to Paul's words to the Ephesians and find within ourselves the same reaction. For both, Paul and Jesus, we must understand context. Paul's challenge about marriage was radical in his day. He was calling men to a higher commitment to marriage and to their spouses. Paul's use of subordinate while is jarring to our ears was common practice for his day. He is quoting here from the standard practice of the Roman and Greek households to which he wrote. It would be as jarring for them to hear us speak of women working outside the home and pursuing professional careers. However, this level of relationship is not the heart of his message. His radical challenge applies to us as well. He calls for an equality of love, respect and reverence within marriage. He challenges us to be for one another, as Christ is for the Church. In our own day we can find it just as difficult to give ourselves fully to one another as Paul calls for. These are hard words. Jesus' disciples had the same reaction to his invitation to take and eat of his flesh and drink of his blood. We have buffered these words with centuries of Eucharistic theology and spirituality. The full jarring effect is muted for us. However, it does not take much imagination to realize how his disciples reacted. These are not the only hard words in the scripture. Love one another, turn the other cheek, settle with your brother before you come to the table, give your cloak, do unto others as you would have them do unto you. Where shall we turn? Peter responds, you Lord, have the words of eternal life, where else shall we go. Many for these and even more idle reasons go home, go to other churches. Yet where else will we find the Eucharist, where will we find his presence with Peter, to whom shall we go? It is a question for each of us. Have a good week. Love, Fr. Peter

Dear Church Family,

Today's gospel reading from St. John struck me in that the disciples were having a difficult time in making a decision. Some of them left Jesus and decided to no longer follow him. Life then, as it is now is about making choices. I have two teenaged daughters, and I've talked about them before, but for any of you who are parents (or were parents to teenagers) know it's a tough time in both their lives and ours. Whenever I drop off my kids somewhere, I usually tell them to "make good choices!". I didn't always make good choices when I was young, and even now I very much rely on God's help in doing so. I have a close friend that I've known forever, and I usually bounce things off her when I'm not sure of what direction to take. Like the disciples in this week's gospel we too find *"This saying is hard."* The disciples were referring to the last words of Jesus, *"this is the bread that came down from heaven . . . whoever eats this bread will live forever."* That statement, was a lot for the disciples to take in. But, the 12 that stayed were stronger willed than those that left. Did they have a greater faith? I don't know, but they made a good choice. Isn't it ironic that it was Simon Peter (who later betrayed Jesus) that said the following: *"You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."*

Yes, those disciples that stayed and followed Jesus, chose to believe. We too choose to believe every time we "make good choices." That's as it should be when we live as we are called to do by our baptism, our belief, and our faith in God.

From what I can see of most of those around here, I say...you're making some pretty good choices. So, keep up the good work, and know that I'm in your corner. Have a great week.
