SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

Last weekend I gave two different homilies. Those who came Saturday night did not hear the same one I gave Sunday morning. Sunday I spoke more directly about the challenge of the Scripture for us to walk the walk as it were. Several people have responded to me about that message through emails, lunch invitations and at the Pastoral Council on Tuesday night this past week. The Council discussed at length ways which our parish can respond to the pressing needs of brothers and sisters all around us. The discussion resulted in their challenge to each of us to give more conscious support to the area Food Closet. The Food Closet began here at St. Michael's. Many years ago, before I arrived it had grown so large that it moved to a space in the Municipal Building. It is operated by the area churches through T I C (Together In Christ). Volunteers from all churches, many from St. Michael's, staff the Closet and distribute food to needy individuals and families. The persons are screened and approved by the Red Cross Office, a system which has been so helpful over the years.

At present there is only enough food to allow persons to come once a month and then they receive only enough for a few days. Weekly, we receive calls and visits from those who have run out again and need more help. People need to eat more than once a month.

AT PRESENT THE FOOD CLOSET IS NEARLY EMPTY!

The Council challenge is that we place baskets on the window sills of the church and make specific requests each week for items needed at the closet. We are a very large congregation and could easily fill the shelves to overflowing.

NEXT WEEK PLEASE BRING PASTA SAUCE, PASTA, DRIED MILK AND TUNA. Place your items on the windows and we will let you know other items needed! Have a good week.

FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

I spent a lot of time reflecting on today's readings. I looked inside myself and wasn't too sure I liked what I saw—because today's readings called me to task. Our faith in Jesus calls us all to task, that is to live our lives in HIM. Well, if you're reading this letter than you probably have attended Mass, and you also probably feel that you're doing your part, but is it enough?

We are reminded in today's second reading from St. James, that rich or poor, it is our faith that matters—but it's how we live our faith that is our salvation. Isn't it often those that are "poor" that are "rich" in faith? Okay, we've all done it...we've seen people in the communion line and wondered why they're there. Yet who are we to judge? Only God has that right.

I have a good friend who was recently divorced, and hadn't received Eucharist since that time. When I questioned her about it, she told me she didn't think she was **ALLOWED** to participate in receiving Eucharist. **Wasn't allowed?** There are still many misconceptions out there, and today's readings remind us of that. I can tell you from my own experience that it's the strength I received from the Eucharist that got me through some of my toughest days. My advice to my friend was to **FULLY** participate in all the sacraments, and to do it often.

We are further reminded of how to live our faith in today's Gospel as St. Mark tells us the story of the deaf man who was cured by Jesus. As Jesus touched the man, he looked up to heaven and said, "be opened!" and the man was healed. Jesus heals all of us in the same way if we ask, but it doesn't just happen. We receive salvation when we live in HIM. So, my prayer today is for the grace I need to do just that...to live in Jesus by opening my eyes, my ears and my mouth—so that I may see, hear and proclaim the Good News! I hope you all will join me in that prayer. Have a wonderful week.

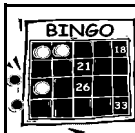
