SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

I received word today that my cousin Eddy died.

While Ed never lived in Auburn, I feel as though we grew up together. His Dad and mine were very close and we spent many summer vacations together over the years. He lived in Plattsburg, the last time I saw him was my anniversary party five years ago. Ed was one year younger than me. At the same time, another cousin Mary, also a first cousin once removed is dying as I write this of cancer in Wisconsin. I would see Mary much less frequently due to distance. Two deaths of contemporaries in my family at the same time leaves me shaken in many ways.

Jesus in today's gospel points to his impending death. Peter is so shaken by this news that he starts to argue with him. Jesus turns on Peter and then reminds all of us that unless we walk his walk we cannot be saved.

"Saved" here is all the little deaths in saying no to self and yes to Jesus. Embracing him here joins us to him in glory when our day comes. I think of that today with Eddy and with Mary my cousins. Yet there remains a difficult hole created by loss and absence. It is difficult to balance all this in one's heart, feelings and faith.

When my Dad died a friend came through the line and simply encouraged me to be patient with myself. I found that to be very wise. Sometimes we can only be patient. Sometimes we must wait not rushing or pushing for things to be as we wish.

So I find myself in one of those spots today needing to wait and be patient. Remembering wonderful times with these cousins and others in the family. Their parents, all dead now, and mine come readily to mind, gatherings we were all at flash in front of me. And in the midst of it I have a vision of them all together around the great communion we call the saints, basking in the light of Jesus' amazing grace, healed and whole, rejoicing and waiting for the rest of us to catch up. FAITH FORMATION ...

Dear Church Family,

Today's Gospel reading from St. Mark consists of a dialogue between Jesus and his disciples in which Jesus describes what the future will hold for him (and we all know it wasn't good). He further questions his followers, and challenges them. How? By telling them, *"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."* That's pretty straight forward. Following Jesus comes with a price, and it's not always easy, but to not follow Jesus comes with an even bigger price. Jesus asks no more of us than he himself was willing to give. He knew he would suffer during his lifetime here on earth. We can expect no less. Today daily living is a challenge in itself. We are inundated with so much "stuff." Our youth struggle to fit in. The elderly often struggle to survive. We live in a society of extremes. Extreme wealth, and extreme poverty. Lifestyles and priorities are skewed. It's more important to attend a sporting event than church. We have to keep up with our neighbors. We need the best of everything, and often are in debt for it. Addictions to alcohol, drugs and sex are at an all time high. Our youth are exposed to more by the time they are 12 or 13, than people of my parents generation knew in their lifetime. But here's the clincher... we may have all this "stuff," but we are not happier for it. Jesus said, *"whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."* Yes, life is a struggle, yet when we make the time for Jesus, deny ourselves, and take up that cross, we find our true happiness. So okay, following Jesus may not always be easy, but it does come with rewards.

Yesterday I called my aunt to wish her a happy 83rd birthday. She's a wonderful woman, and I greatly admire her. She lost her husband to cancer when she was only 42, and raised her 3 children on her own. Her life was often a struggle, yet yesterday she told me how blessed she was. She has a loving family, and good friends. She told me she was often lonely, but didn't take the time to feel sorry for herself because she was just too busy. But she ALWAYS took the time to attend Mass—she still never misses, and she is happy and feels blessed. I'm sharing this little story with you to illustrate my point, we find our true happiness in God. I'm running out of room, so enough said.
