**SOME THINGS CONSIDER**

I have been reflecting a good deal on the horror in Pennsylvania last week. The thought of those young girls suffering and in the end dying at the hands of their captor haunts my thoughts. Yet nearly as strong in my mind is the image of their parents and families, friends and fellow Amish going to the house of their killer, Mr. Roberts. Many men from the local Amish community went to the Roberts family to tell them from their hearts that both he and they were forgiven. They went to ask if there was any way they could be of help to the Roberts family during these days of tragedy. It is stunning. I am tempted to say I do not recall seeing the like of it before, at least not that quickly.

Forgiveness is powerful medicine. Jesus calls us to live the same forgiveness we saw in Pennsylvania last week.

Sadly, many of us, myself included, find it so hard to do. I am aware of a circumstance in my own life recently where forgiveness has been difficult. I have found myself stuck in my disappointment, anger at the persons involved. I have searched and searched my heart for why forgiveness has been so difficult. Then from the newspaper and television comes the witness of the Amish men arriving within twenty-four hours to say we forgive you.

It applies in our individual lives, within our homes and marriages. It applies within our churches and community organizations. It applies in our relations with North Korea, Iran, Iraq and whomever we find ourselves at odds with. Forgiveness is powerful medicine and my life needs it. I am quite sure each of our lives needs it. I know our world needs it. It begins with a decision within our hearts. Anger and resentment can begin spontaneously from events and circumstances. Forgiveness is a decision we make. Each of us chooses to say: "I forgive you." When we do there is powerful medicine which begins healing.

## FAITH FORMATION/YOUTH MINISTRY

Dear Church Family,

As I write this letter to you today, I again find it amazing how God works in my life, as today's Gospel from St. Mark spoke directly to me in so many experiences I've recently had. I'll get to that later, but what especially struck me in this Gospel was the question the rich man posed to Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus' response speaks to us all. He gave a simple, straight forward command...by first reminding him of the commandments. Then Jesus further goes on and tells him to go—sell—give—then finally come and follow. The man went away sad, as he had many possessions. How well can you relate to the rich man? So now I pose the following questions to you. What is it that you have, that you simply can not live without? Is there anything that important to you? And what is it that truly makes you happy? Here's the part where my recent experiences come in...

At the last First Penance preparation, I asked the kids what made them happy. Their responses surprised me. So many people think young people today are very materialistic (they are no more so than their parents teach them to be). One answer particularly touched me, "*When my dad smiles, and he's not in pain.*" Honestly, most of the answers were similar to this one. It isn't "things" that makes these kids happy, just like it's not "things" that makes us happy. Here's another example of that. Yesterday, I took my daughter and two of her friends out to dinner. One of the girls is moving away in a couple of days, so this dinner was a send off for her. She has not had an easy couple of years. She lost both her parents in an automobile accident, and has lived in several (I believe four) different locations since then, her most recent being here in Newark. That's where we got to know her. So on our way to dinner we were admiring a spectacular sunset, and she told us a story about her mom. She said in the house they used to live in, they had a back deck that overlooked a hill, and had a great view of sunsets. She told us her mom would go out often to watch the sun set, and would say, "Look what God did." She said every time she sees a beautiful sunset she thinks about her mom. I told her that's a wonderful way to remember her. Do you think it's "things" that make this young girl happy? I don't think so. Even though she's moved so many times, she said she met a lot of great people, so there must have been a reason for it. We all need to find reason in our lives. Our "things" don't give us that. Our family does. Our friends do. Our faith in God does. These are the "things" we can not live without. Please pray for this young girl as she starts a new chapter in her life. And let's continue to pray for one another, so that we may better understand what truly makes us happy.
