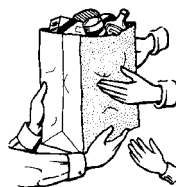

FAITH FORMATION/YOUTH MINISTRY

Dear Church Family,

In today's Gospel from St. Mark, James and John ask for glory in the coming kingdom. They want to reside beside Jesus in the next life. Jesus' reply brings them back down to earth. Did they live their lives in a way that would enable them to be rewarded that way? Can we possibly live our lives in such a way as to qualify for that kind of glory? Honestly, the answer is no. Of course I'm certainly looking forward to my heavenly reward, but whether or not I achieve that is God's decision, not mine.

None of us can live up to what Jesus did for us. Our lives as Christians are meant to emulate that. Jesus is our example. We however need to put this into perspective.

I recently read a very interesting article that a parishioner gave me. It was entitled, "Who is Jesus?" and asks the question—How do you see Jesus? As a friend, or brother? Yes, he is both of those, yet he is also GOD. That's the part many of us forget, or at least don't focus on. We are able to relate to Jesus, because he lived as one of us—BUT he was divine. Truly human, yet truly divine. None of us can live up to that, but we can certainly try at living the best way we can.

What really got my attention in today's Gospel was the last line, which reminds us of Jesus' true nature.

"For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." Jesus came to be one of us, to serve us, to teach us how to live. We learn from his word, his example, the way he lived his life. What he did for us goes beyond our reasoning. He loved us enough to bear the burden of our sins, and died for that burden. He was God, yet he died for us. It almost seems a contradiction, but what it was...what it is...is unconditional love. How blessed are we to be loved that much!

The following is an excerpt from Mother Teresa's Nobel Peace Prize Lecture from 1979. It firmly makes the point of just how much Jesus loved us:

"It hurt Jesus to love us, it hurt him. And to make sure we remember his great love he made himself the bread of life to satisfy our hunger for his love. Our hunger for God, because we have been created for that love. We have been created in his image. We have been created to love and be loved, and then he has become man to make it possible for us to love as he loved us. He makes himself the hungry one - the naked one - the homeless one - the sick one - the one in prison - the lonely one - the unwanted one - and he says: You did it to me." If Jesus could love us this much, I don't think it's too much for us to live in his love in return.
