SOME THINGS CONSIDERED

Today's gospel is an important one. I say that because this incident of Jesus summing up the Law and Prophets occurs in each of Matthew, Mark and Luke. When we see that happen it is a signal about how deeply the early church felt about a given scene in Jesus' life. At the end of today's text Jesus assures the scribe that 'he is not far from the kingdom of God.' We each desire that kind of promise. Jesus makes the assurance based upon the Scribes insight that to love God with all our heart, mind, and soul, and our neighbor as ourselves. This is the fullness of the Law and more important even than sacrifice. He refers here to the ritual sacrifices made at the Temple in Jerusalem. But, while Jesus gives him assurance he does not dismiss sacrifice. Jesus' very act of salvation is his sacrifice on the cross. It is the most perfect sacrifice. The path of discipleship then is that full love of God and neighbor even in the pouring out of oneself in sacrifice. Those sacrifices are made daily by parents for their children and spouses for one another. Those sacrifices are made by children for their ailing parents and other friends and neighbors. Those sacrifices are made every time we give of ourselves on behalf of another, those we know and those we do not. Love of God and neighbor is not something we think about much less do in the quiet of our hearts. Love of God and neighbor is done in active pouring out of ourselves on behalf of one another. Have you pledged toward the Catholic Ministry Appeal as yet. We show in today's bulletin the names of those who have pledged as of Monday of this last week. We will list and in that way thank all who have given each week through the end of the Appeal. I could simply not fulfill the responsibilities of my position without the support of the Diocese.
