# St. Michael's Church Newark, New York

November 11, 2007

In this month of November, the Church remembers those who have died. We begin the month with the Solemnity of All Saints, honoring all the saints in heaven, God's holy ones. It celebrates all the holy men and women throughout the ages who exemplified the faith; whose lives, in some way or another, mirrored the Paschal Mystery of Christ. On November 2 we remember all of the faithfully departed who, we pray, may one day join the saints in heaven.

Yesterday, we had our annual remembrance service to remember those who have died from our parish community here at St. Michael's. We remembered in song and prayer, lighting candles to remind us that their light has been joined with Christ's light.

Up here in the northern hemisphere the natural cycle lends itself to a focus of praying for the dead. The landscape of November is often barren and gray as nature seemingly "dies," but in actuality enters the long sleep of winter. It is in this context that the liturgy of the Church turns our thoughts to our own mortality, the temporary nature of our lives on earth, and the great harvest into heaven of all people at the end of time.

We will be lighting the Paschal candle at each of our Masses throughout November, reminding us of the light that Christ brings into our lives as baptized disciples. The Paschal candle is lit at the Easter Vigil and reminds us that Christ came into our world to bring light into our darkness, hope into our lives. Near the Paschal candle, which is next to the baptismal font, is a Remembrance book that you may write the names of loved ones you would like remembered during this month. We will remember them at all of our Masses as we pray for our deceased family and friends.

I love the prayer that we pray at Funeral liturgies: "Lord, for your faithful people life is changed, not ended. When the body of our earthly dwelling lies in death we gain an everlasting dwelling place in heaven." May all of our deceased loved ones be dwelling with our most merciful and gracious God.

Today is also Veterans Day, a day that we remember, thank and honor all of our men and women who served in the military. A big thank you to the men and women from our parish community who have served and sacrificed for our country!

Dear Church Family,

Today's gospel reading is about hope. I like that word—hope. I like the feeling of being hopeful, yet I don't experience it with any regularity. That's just me, but I suspect it's many of us. So today's gospel is for all of us—and it gives us hope.

I don't often write about any readings other than the gospel, but I found today's first reading inspiring. Why? Because the brothers in this story had such a strong faith, that it gave them hope. They believed in their own resurrection, that God would lead them to eternal life. *"It is my choice to die at the hands of men with the hope God gives of being raised up by him."* **2 Mc 7:14.** They were way ahead of their time in this belief. Even centuries later, many people still didn't believe in resurrection, as was shown in today's gospel. The Sadducees were trying to test Jesus by putting a question to him that basically denied resurrection. *Honestly, I wish I had just a tiny bit of Jesus' ability—he had an answer for everything!* Anyway, his response to the situation posed to him (about the woman married many times over) was probably very unexpected to the Sadducees, but is certainly wonderful for us. In speaking of what will happen to all of us after we die, Jesus says, *"They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise."* **Luke 20:36.** He later describes God in this way, *"He is not a God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."* **Luke 20:38.** Now that is a message of hope! With God—with Jesus—we are given eternal life in glory!

My mom isn't too fond of this reading, because in it Jesus explains that in heaven, we aren't married because there is no need to be. I remember talking to Fr. Peter about this and he concurred. "There's no reason for marriage in heaven!" he boomed to me. But...I personally am under the impression that heaven is beyond all comprehension. I imagine it to be so magnificent, that I'm not really able to imagine it. Still, I'll take a stab at it. If we are blessed enough to have a marriage and a love so wonderful that we still want it in heaven, then why not? For me, well...I certainly dream of the day I'm reunited with those loved ones I've lost. I dream of being held in the arms of my dad again. And I dream of a day when I can also be held in the arm of my savior. What do you imagine heaven to be for you? I'm pretty sure it will be vastly different for each of us. So, as for me—and as for now—I'm just going to do my best to live this life the way my faith teaches me to. Because by doing that, I'll have something (too great to comprehend) to look forward to.
