SOME THINGS CONSIDERED
Transitioning toward a New Pastor

In my first article I mentioned that I would monthly try to cover various aspects of the transition process. Last month, I wrote about the process and the eligible candidates who may apply for the position. In summary the process begins in January with the Pastoral Council meeting with a representative of the Priest Personnel Board. The openings will be announced in late February. The candidates are all eligible priests and all Pastoral Administrators (lay men or women who lead a parish in the place of a priest pastor, along with the Administrator of the diocese will also appoint a priest to provide Sacramental Ministry). The Personnel Board will receive the applications and make a recommendation for appointment to Bishop Clark.

Today I would like to update you on St. Michael's and its relationship with our planning group "The Catholic Community of Western Wayne County". The CCWWC is currently operating under an approved plan which runs through 2008. The plan assumes that St. Mary's Ontario, Epiphany and St. Rose Sodus will become one parish and that St. Ann's, St. Gregory's and St. Patrick's, Macedon will become one parish. Thus, by 2013 there will be three parishes in the group, St. Michael's and these other two. The plan further assumes that three priests will serve this area, although it does not presume where they will live or how they will be assigned.

St. Michael's will be associated with the other parishes along route 31.

We already pursue several common efforts, Confirmation preparation and Stephen Ministry are presently being done as a group. In the future there will be a fuller blending of ministry and association among the parishes.

Further, I envision a time when the priest at St. Michael's will also have to broadened sacramental responsibility within the CCWWC. Presently, I celebrate the Tuesday daily Mass in Ontario as well as covering Funerals and Weddings. It seems inevitable that there will be a greater need as further consolidations take place. In addition St. Michael's will begin to share other aspects of ministry among the Route 31 parishes in the future. It is essential that we realize that we are not alone and more importantly that we are even stronger as we join efforts with one another.

FAITH FORMATION/YOUTH MINISTRY

Dear Church Family,

Today's reading from St. Mark is a clear message to us all about the importance of sharing our gifts. The poor widow in today's gospel gave her livelihood by placing her two coins in the treasury. Although others gave more, Jesus reminds us that her small amount was all she had, not her surplus. I read a commentary that described this act as, "*selfless giving and giving of self,*" and that's just the way I saw it. I'm not suggesting that (like the poor widow) we give away all we have. On the contrary that is not realistic at all. I also know that not everyone among us is capable of giving vast amounts of money to the many charitable organizations of which we are asked — let alone to our church. But, we are ALL capable of giving in some manner. I see *so* many examples of that right here in our own church community—all of you give of your time, be it as ushers, working in the Martha ministry or Stephen ministry, making prayer shawls, praying the Rosary for the unborn, working the rummage sale, being a Eucharistic minister or lector or commentator. Sharing your talent in our music ministry, volunteering your time with the youth as a catechist or helping with children's Liturgy, or directing a children's choir—then there's the Bazaar that's coming up, and our yearly festival! That's just a portion of the way that you all give to our church, and yes, I could go on and on, but I hope you get the point.

Right now, I'm in the process of getting a new roof on my house. As you know this is not an inexpensive endeavor, and I also have a daughter in her second year of college—heck I'm a single parent and I work for the Church...so as you'd expect, money is tight. However, I can usually find some money to spend on inconsequential things that I feel I "must" have, so I should be able to spare some for those things that are of greater consequence! Do you remember a couple of weeks ago when I asked you to consider donating a couple of dollars to our Youth Ministry collection? If I'm running short on cash in any given week, then I try to give in other ways. I'm a firm believer that something as simple as a smile can go along way. I know it does with me. If we all work together in little ways, we can make a difference in big ways, not just in other's lives, but in ours as well.

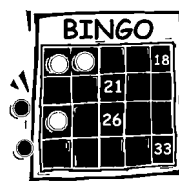
