God our Father,
 By raising Christ your Son
 you conquered the power of death
 and opened for us the way to eternal life.
 Let our celebration today
 raise us up and renew our lives
 by the Spirit that is within us.

This is the Opening Prayer for our Easter liturgies and certainly reminds us of the very foundation of our faith; that Christ our Savior has conquered the power of death and opened for us the way to eternal life.

Easter is our annual reminder that we are people who are on our way to eternal life. But if we truly understand what we celebrate on Sunday, every Eucharistic liturgy is an Easter celebration, even during the Sundays of Lent. We celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ's persecution, death and resurrection. At every Sunday Mass, we *remember* Christ's loving act of salvation for us. However, it is not a remembering of a past event. Our prayer at Easter and every liturgy makes present the One who died and rose from the dead for us. The Risen One is real and in our midst! So, we remember not a past event but the saving action of God who makes himself present to us in the bread and wine, the Word proclaimed, the Presider, and in our community gathered for the celebration.


The God who saved us over 2000 years ago through his son's selfless act of love still saves us today and calls us to new life. God raises us up and renews our lives at every Eucharist and every time we remember God's powerful and passionate love for us. Does this mean that we *understand* the mystery of Jesus Christ's identity? No, not in a rational way. Through the eyes of faith, though, we can say yes and be enlivened by this mystery of our faith. It is a journey of faith that calls us to deeper and deeper understanding and faith. The God who makes himself present in the breaking of the bread calls each and every one of us to deeper union with him and with each other. In this journey the Spirit renews us and raises us up to greater life.

May this Easter Season be one of great joy and hope as we journey together and continue to deepen our relationship with the God who saves us yesterday, today, and forever!

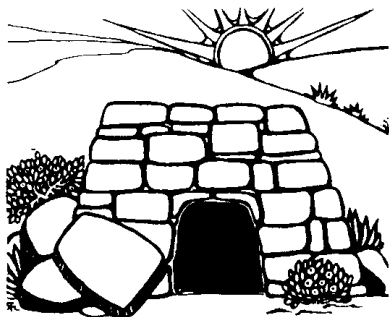

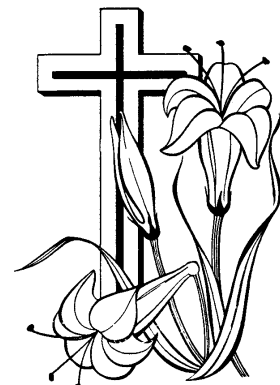
