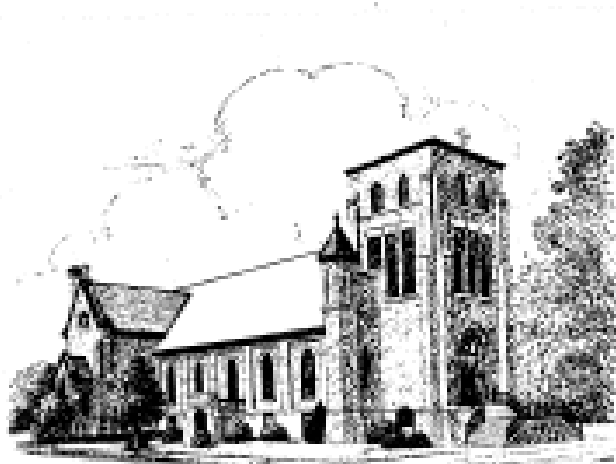

¡Resucitó! ¡Resucitó! ¡Las Buenas Noticias!

¡Bienvenidos a todos en este día de la Resurrección de Jesucristo! De nuevo todos cantamos "aleluya" al saber que la promesa de la resurrección es una realidad. Nuestra fe cristiana empezó con un mensaje muy específico: Jesús crucificado resucitó de entre los muertos; Jesucristo es nuestro Salvador y es siempre presente. Por todo el Nuevo Testamento encontramos este gran misterio como la base de la fe y la prédica de los seguidores de Jesús. La redención del pecado y la vida resucitada dependían de la resurrección de Jesús. Este misterio es el corazón de nuestra fe; junto al envío del Espíritu Santo es la culminación de la revelación de Dios a nosotros. Nuestra respuesta a la consagración del pan y del vino en la misa es: "Por tu cruz y resurrección nos has salvado, Señor."

La tumba vacía, el testimonio de los que habían visto y hablado con Jesucristo vivo después de su resurrección y el poder de la gracia nos dan razón por creer en la resurrección de Jesucristo y en nuestra propia resurrección. También esta creencia nos da la fuerza para enfrentar la muerte, el rechazo, el odio, y las cosas difíciles de la vida. Hemos experimentado dolor, discriminación, cambios en la iglesia, la familia y la sociedad, y por la resurrección gradualmente la pena es transformada y podemos estar guiados hacia la Vida Real.

Este misterio es tan importante que lo celebramos como una fiesta de cincuenta días—hasta el Pentecostés. Por eso durante este tiempo decimos que el 11 de abril es el segundo domingo de Pascua, el 18 de abril es el tercer domingo de Pascua, etc. ¡Qué fiesta tan larga! Durante el tiempo de Pascua el cirio pascual es visible frente a nosotros y es Jesús resucitado que es un guía; es nuestro pilar del fuego en la noche y nuestro esplendor durante el día. En los *Hechos de los Apóstoles* que leemos durante este tiempo escuchamos la valentía, las acciones y enseñanza de los seguidores de Jesús quienes predicaban en el nombre de Jesucristo matado y resucitado. ¡Es un tiempo de gozo—de aleluya!

¿Dónde caben el conejito de Pascua y los huevos? Los alemanes trajeron a nuestro país el conejo pascual. Los niños creyeron que si se portaran bien, el conejito dejaría un nido de huevos de color. Los niños preparaban un nido para el conejito, usando sus gorros y sombreros. Durante la edad media no se comían los huevos durante la cuaresma, pero los hirvieron para preservarlos para comer durante el tiempo de pascua. ¡Que pasen bien el gozo y la esperanza de este tiempo!

Dear Church Family,

JESUS CHRIST IS RISEN TODAY ~ ALLELUIA!
Today is a day of celebration for us. A day to celebrate with our Risen Lord! In this day we will come face to face with our Living God—in the bread of life—the Eucharist!

The Eucharist is the pinnacle of our Liturgy. It is the core of our celebration, and in this way it is united with the centrality of our faith, which is the Resurrection of Jesus Christ! This Easter, this most holy of days in our entire Church year, truly is a celebration. It is a day of promises fulfilled. A day of erased doubt and renewed faith. It is a day of inspiration—a reminder that even if we are wounded or hurt, there is reassurance and life! This is a day of knowing confidence that love always conquers death. This is Easter!

How will you celebrate this day? If you're reading this than you probably most likely began your Easter with the Holy Mass. It is within the context of the Mass that we are closest to God. At Mass we readily ask for forgiveness of sins, and through receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, our sins are forgiven. What a joyful way to express our love to God—by asking for forgiveness. And what an amazing way to receive forgiveness—by sharing in the sacrament of the Eucharist! Easter allows us the opportunity of reconciliation through prayer, song, worship and sacrament. But guess what? Every Sunday gives us this same opportunity! We are invited to the table of the Lord, not just on Easter or Christmas, but every week, and during the week as well! But I won't get ahead of myself! Every Sunday is fine, and attending Mass every Sunday fulfills one of the Precepts of our faith. And here's a refresher for you on the **Precepts of the Church** (CCC #2041-3):

1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.

The Precepts of the Catholic Church are a description of the *minimum* actions required of Catholics regarding the Church. They are a reminder to us that our Christian life requires a commitment to prayer and active participation in the liturgy and sacraments. And I thought...what better time to re-commit to your faith than Easter?

May our Risen Lord bless you all with a joyous and renewing Easter. Love, Jeanette
