Pablo escribió de las personas que viven según Cristo como criaturas nuevas. Quizás al final de este tiempo de la Cuaresma algunas van a ser criaturas más nuevas que otras porque hay más que necesitan cambiar. Los valores, actitudes, tipos de acciones, relaciones con otras, tipos de decisiones, etc. van cambiándose hacia lo que Cristo desea de nosotros mientras prestamos más atención a lo que Cristo nos aconseja en los evangelios. ¿Qué apariencia damos a otros al llegar a este cuarto domingo de Cuaresma? ¿Somos los viejos del día ante de miércoles de ceniza o hemos empezado a volver a Cristo con todo nuestro corazón? ¿El corazón está más blando, más entregado a Cristo y su misión o seguimos con los mismos pensamientos malos y acciones malas de antes? Este tiempo de Cuaresma es para que conozcamos a Cristo más, estar evangelizados—estar cambiados interiormente y así poder evangelizar a otras siendo un embajador de Cristo. Así Pablo nos pide: "en nombre de Cristo les pedimos que se reconcilien con Dios."

Estos son solamente unos de los muchos pecados que son posibles y necesitan estar cambiados para ponerse bien con Dios y ser criaturas nuevas.

Necesitamos mirarnos bien interiormente para admitir que sí hacemos una(s) de estas cosas u otra cosa que no va bien con la enseñanza de Cristo. "Perdón, o Dios mío" es nuestra oración. "Si grandes son mis culpas, mayor es tu bondad." Dios siempre está con nosotros. Si pongo de mi parte, Dios va a entregarme su misericordia, y así haciéndome una criatura nueva. ¡Entonces que seamos embajadores de Cristo!

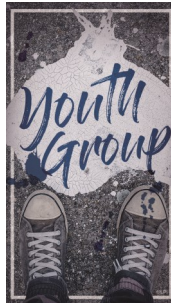

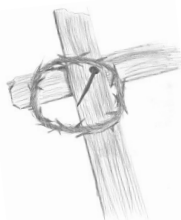
