Ya Llegó la Semana Santa

Esta semana es repleta de liturgias y celebraciones de los eventos más importantes de nuestra fe: Domingo de Ramos de la pasión del Señor, Jueves Santo y el lavatorio de los pies y la institución de la Eucaristía, Viernes Santo recordando el sufrimiento, la pasión y muerte de Jesucristo, y la Vigilia Pascual recordando la historia de salvación y su cumplimiento en la resurrección de Jesucristo. Tan importante es vivir plenamente cada celebración durante esta semana para poder acercarse más a Dios Jesucristo. Viva las celebraciones. El domingo alce y agite los ramos benditos y cante la victoria del rey: "Bendito el rey que viene en el nombre del Señor." Por qué no lleva sus palmas a casa y ponerlas en un lugar visible donde durante el año se puede recordar que la victoria de Cristo y del cristiano se obtiene a través del sufrimiento y de la cruz.

Jueves Santo recordamos una acción humilde de Jesús cuando Jesús lavó y secó los pies a sus discípulos. Al final de esto, Jesús les hizo una pregunta: ¿comprenden lo que acabo de hacer con ustedes?" Hay que entender el mensaje y tenemos que seguir el ejemplo de Cristo. Tenemos que quitarnos el manto (de superioridad) y servir al otro y secar con misericordia las lágrimas del otro. Hay que intentar comprender para que realmente seamos sirvientes a los demás. Después se dio a todos por medio de la Eucaristía.

Viernes Santo—un día más solemne y con más silencio. Delante de Jesús crucificado y muerto cada cual debe vivir su propio camino con la cruz a cuestas, un camino de distintos sufrimientos y muerte. A la vez podemos recordar que es un camino de amor y fidelidad mutuo. Es un día cuando Dios está dispuesto a perdonarnos, no importa cuán graves son los pecados que hemos cometido.

Vigilia Pascual—tenemos la oportunidad de escuchar de nuevo algunas obras que Dios hizo para su pueblo durante la historia ante de Cristo. Por fin escuchamos el evangelio: el primer día después del sábado las mujeres encontraron la tumba vacía. Dos ángeles proclaman a Cristo resucitado.

¿Recuerdan lo que Él dijo?
¡Cristo ha resucitado! ¡Cristo está vivo! Es vivo todavía hoy. Vive entre nosotros, dentro de nosotros. Es vivo en la Eucaristía y tantas veces olvidamos el gran regalo tenemos. Su

palabra es verdadera. Su resurrección garantiza la nuestra. Celebraremos esta semana tan especial.

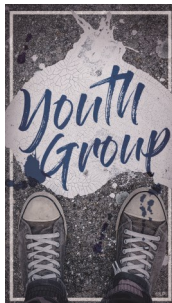

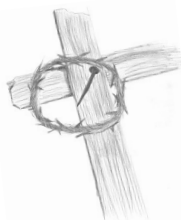
