Jeff has been hearing confessions during the week, once a month. Fr. Jeff also presides over a Holy Hour with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament once a month. During the month of May, these opportunities need to be rescheduled as Fr. Jeff will be away attending the annual diocesan convocation. Therefore, in May, both the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Holy Hour will both be offered on Tuesday, May 21st as follows:

Parish Pastoral Council Nominations

You may know we have a Parish Pastoral Council but do you know what this council does? The council helps the pastor develop a vision for the parish, helps the pastor determine the priorities of the parish, and promote communication to the parish. Our council has nine adult members and two youth members.

The adult members of the council serve three-year terms, renewable once, while the youth members serve one-year terms, renewable as long as they are in high school. This year we will be selecting three adult parishioners to begin three-year terms on the council. We are now taking nominations until May 19th. We will select the members in a drawing at the end of the 10:30 am Mass on May 26th.

To serve on the council, one must be a registered and supporting member of our parish who regularly attends Mass and is committed to dialogue and spiritual growth. You may nominate yourself or others. All nominated people will be contacted before we select names on May 26th. Nomination forms can be found in church.

**Cristo Verdaderamente Se Da a
Nosotros en la Eucaristía**

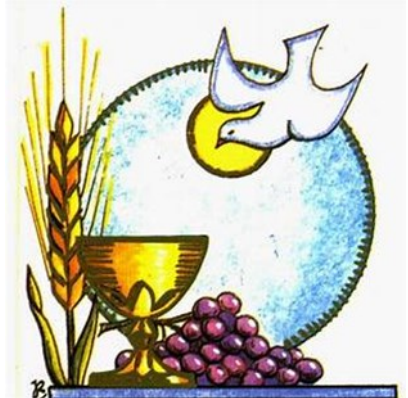
Hoy los niños de la parroquia están recibiendo por primera vez el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Plenamente están participando en la Eucaristía—nuestra acción de gracias a Dios. Por mucho tiempo no han podido recibir a Cristo sacramentalmente, por no entender este verdadero regalo a nosotros.

Ya sabemos que Cristo está presente siempre en su Iglesia, y especialmente en las celebraciones litúrgicas que tenemos—las celebraciones de los sacramentos y la oración de las horas. En 1963 los obispos dijeron que Cristo está presente en la Misa y en la persona del ministro de la Misa, en la Palabra de Dios que escuchamos leída de la Biblia durante la Misa. Dios está presente en los sacramentos y en la asamblea que se reúne para orar, escuchar y cantar. Verdaderamente Cristo nos da su cuerpo y su sangre en la Eucaristía. Cristo se nos comunica íntimamente en este sacramento.

Esta presencia de Cristo con nosotros nos puede ayudar entender el gran hueco en nuestras vidas cuando no hemos recibido a Cristo sacramentalmente durante la Misa por algunos días, semanas o meses. Un amigo, un querido no está presente íntimamente. En la Eucaristía es Cristo quien está dándose personalmente y literalmente a la persona que se abre para recibirlo. Por recibir a Cristo en el tiempo de la Comunión en la Misa podemos profundizar la presencia de Cristo en nuestras vidas. Cristo se nos da como alimento; nuestra relación con Cristo puede crecer y debe profundizarse. Espero también, mientras estemos recibiendo a Cristo en nuestras vidas, estamos como comunidad, como Iglesia listos para vivir el evangelio y ayudar a otras. Cristo se nos da para darnos fuerza como Iglesia; entonces podemos decir que es Cristo que está actuando por medio de nosotros, la comunidad: la Iglesia.

Cuando comamos una comida tan especial vamos a estar aún más unidos en comunidad. No habrá diferencias porque todos hemos comido la misma comida: el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, y Cristo nos da a todos el mismo mensaje de amor.

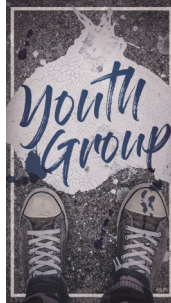

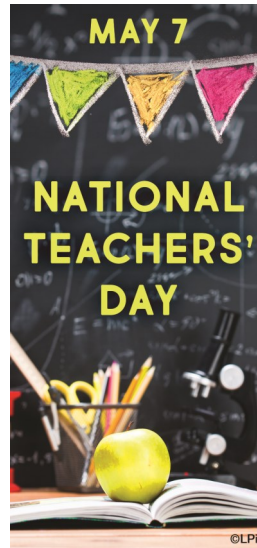
