

Jeff has been hearing confessions during the week, once a month. Fr. Jeff also presides over a Holy Hour with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament once a month. During the month of May, these opportunities need to be rescheduled as Fr. Jeff will be away attending the annual diocesan convocation. Parish Pastoral Council Nominations

You may know we have a Parish Pastoral Council but do you know what this council does? The council helps the pastor develop a vision for the parish, helps the pastor determine the priorities of the parish, and promote communication to the parish. Our council has nine adult members and two youth members.

The adult members of the council serve three-year terms, renewable once, while the youth members serve one-year terms, renewable as long as they are in high school. This year we will be selecting three adult parishioners to begin three-year terms on the council. We are now taking nominations until May 19th. We will select the members in a drawing at the end of the 10:30 am Mass on May 26th.

To serve on the council, one must be a registered and supporting member of our parish who regularly attends Mass and

is committed to dialogue and spiritual growth. You may nominate yourself or others. All nominated people will be contacted before we select names on May 26th. Nomination forms can be found in church.

Los Años Pasan y Mi Compromiso Se Mantiene Fuerte

Este año es un año especial para mí, y quiero que ustedes compartan mi gozo por haber sido una Hermana de la Misericordia por 60 años. Recientemente un artículo apareció en el periódico *Catholic Courier* sobre los que estamos celebrando aniversarios especiales y lo siguiente es lo que fue escrito sobre mí. *Hermana Kay*

Hermana Kay Schwenzer comenzó su ministerio como una Hermana de la Misericordia enseñando estudios de religión, historia y cultura asiático-africana en Elmira, pero 10 años más tarde, los dos meses y medio en la India por medio de una beca Fullbright provocaron un interrogatorio interior en ella sobre su cuarto voto de servicio a los necesitados que le llevó a un nuevo camino dos años después.



"Algo en lo que nunca había pensado años antes se hizo realidad cuando me arriesgué a sacar el pie de la costa conocida para ingresar a un ministerio desconocido en Chile", dijo. Ella estuvo allí desde 1976-89 como misionera y parte del tiempo también fue directora de novicias.

"Me sumergí en otra cultura, en la calidez y el amor de otras personas que me aceptaron con mi limitado español y en la energía de la iglesia chilena, que se mantuvo firme al lado de los pobres durante un período de dictadura. A través del ejemplo del párroco,

comencé a comprender mejor qué es la justicia y cómo servir con compasión y justicia. "Al ministrar entre los jóvenes, adquirí algo de su entusiasmo. Incluso hoy, me mantengo en contacto con algunos de los antiguos líderes juveniles", afirmó.

Una vez de regreso a Rochester, se desempeñó como asociada pastoral hispana en las parroquias de San Miguel y Nuestra Señora del Perpetuo Socorro en Rochester. Ahora, durante 12 años, ha ministrado entre los hispanos en los condados de Finger Lakes de Yates, Ontario, Wayne y Séneca con oficinas en Geneva y Newark. Su corazón "se dirige a los indocumentados y a los que buscan asilo que vienen a este país para escapar la violencia y la pobreza y los que buscan una vida mejor para sus familias. Demasiados son deportados y separados de sus familias." "Quiero mucho mi ministerio." Lema: Cristo está vivo en mí hoy.


