

#### Clustering and New Mass Schedule

As announced last weekend, we received official word from the diocese that we will be implementing the regional plan and become a cluster of three parishes along with St. Joseph the Worker (Lyons/Clyde/Savannah) and the Catholic Community of the Blessed Trinity (Wolcott/Red Creek/Fair Haven). The changes will be effective Tuesday, June 25<sup>th</sup>. While our *Sunday Masses will remain at 8:15 am and 10:30 am*, we will no longer have a Saturday evening Mass after June 25<sup>th</sup>. There is a 4:00 pm Mass in Lyons, St. Michael Church on Saturday evenings. There will also be changes coming in the daily Mass scheduled. Please stay tuned for more details and pray for the successful clustering of our parishes. Pray that we be the Church that SCHEDULE God calls us to be.

## Catholic Ministries Appeal "Sharing Our Blessings" Ends This Week!

As of May 13<sup>th</sup>, 225 of our parishioner have contributed \$41,949 to our annual diocesan appeal. A very big *Thank you to everyone who has already contributed*. We would not have make it this far without you. We are still \$2,902 short of our goal. You can contribute anytime until May 31<sup>st</sup>. If we do not make our goal the parish must make up the difference. If you have been paying in installments, final payment needs to be sent in by May 31<sup>st</sup>

#### **Parish Pastoral Council Nominations**

You may know we have a Parish Pastoral Council but do you know what this council does? The council helps the pastor develop a vision for the parish, helps the pastor determine the priorities of the parish, and promote communication to the parish. Our council has nine adult members and two youth members.

The adult members of the council serve three-year terms, renewable once, while the youth members serve one-year terms, renewable as long as they are in high school. This year we will be selecting three adult parishioners to begin three-year terms on the council. We will select the members in a drawing at the end of the 10:30 am Mass this weekend.

To serve on the council, one must be a registered and supporting member of our parish who regularly attends Mass and is committed to dialogue and spiritual growth. You may nominate yourself or others. All nominated people will be contacted before we select names on May 26<sup>th</sup>. Nomination forms can be found in church.
