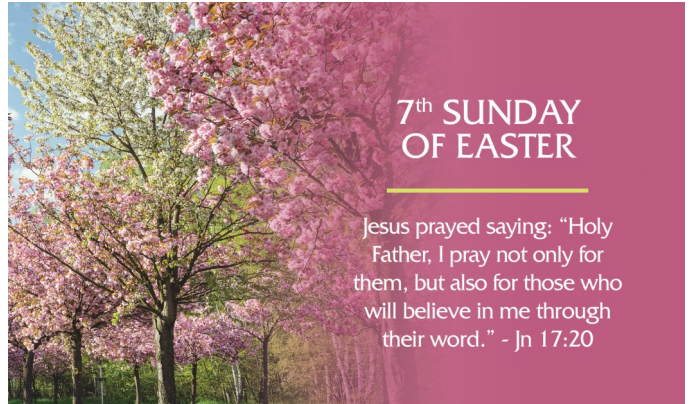

## Lleno del Espíritu Santo, Hablaban en el Nombre de Jesús

¡Espíritu Santo! Ya está; ya está dentro de nosotros desde nacimiento. Al leer el libro de la biblia, *Los Hechos de los Apóstoles*, van a encontrar que hay una referencia constante a la acción del Espíritu Santo en las vidas y enseñanza de los apóstoles. Después de consultar al Espíritu Santo, hacían decisiones; sintiendo la presencia del Espíritu los discípulos pudieron actuar, predicar, sanar, hacer decisiones para la comunidad y vivir juntos en comunidad. Sintieron que fue el Espíritu Santo que estaba dirigiéndoles en el camino de su misión de hablar en el nombre de Cristo. Ellos, llenos del Espíritu Santo, hablaban en el nombre de Jesucristo. Es como no pudieron callarse porque la presencia del Espíritu Santo estaba tan fuerte dentro de sí. Orar, hablar y actuar *en el nombre de Jesús* implica que lo que pedimos, hablamos y hacemos está acorde con lo que Jesús ha enseñado y desea de nosotros.

San Pablo escribe en su segunda carta a los Corintios: "Nos presentamos como embajadores de Cristo, como si Dios mismo les exhortara por nuestra boca" (2 Cor. 5: 20). Cuando cantamos la canción *Salgamos a Llevar el Evangelio*, ¿tú piensas en el significado de lo que estás cantando? Ofrecemos a otros—a todos la vida de Jesús, quien por medio de nosotros consuela a los que sufren y a los que aparentemente están en tinieblas. No tienen mucha esperanza. Los discípulos de la iglesia del primer siglo ofrecieron una esperanza nueva en Jesucristo; ofrecieron amor, compasión, justicia y misericordia. Ofrecieron a todos el mensaje y la persona de Jesucristo. Nosotros también podemos ofrecer lo mismo a tanta gente que está encerrada en un mundo sin significado, una gente que tantas veces está deprimida. Tenemos una brújula que nos ayuda navegar las aguas de la vida y podemos entregar esa a la gente en búsqueda. Es una brújula fijada en Jesucristo.

¿Qué has hecho esta semana para ayudar a otro llegar a Jesucristo? ¿Te sientes la presencia del Espíritu Santo vibrando dentro de ti y listo para salir por tu boca y tus acciones? Acuérdate que tienes que estar abierto a la acción del Espíritu y dispuesto a actuar según sus impulsos. A veces es difícil, pero muy gratificante.

O.k., ahora salgamos a llevar el evangelio. *Hermana Kay*

## 60 Years as a Sister of Mercy

Thank you to the many who have congratulated me for my jubilee year. I am very happy to have been a Sister of Mercy for these many years! The actual date is Sept. 13, but as a congregation we celebrated on May 18. Below is what was written about me in the *Catholic Courier*. *Sister Kay*

**Sister Kay** began her ministry as a Sister of Mercy teaching religion, history and Asian-African culture studies in Elmira, but 10 years later, **Sister Kay Schwenzler's** two-and-a-half months in India on a Fullbright grant caused interior questioning about her fourth vow of service to those in need that led to a new path two years later.

"Something I had never thought of years before became a reality when I risked taking my foot off the known shore to step into the unknown ministry in Chile," she said. She was there from 1976-89 as a missionary and part of the time also was director of novices. "I became immersed in another culture, in the warmth and love of others who accepted me with my limited Spanish, and in the energy of the Chilean church, which stood firmly on the side of the poor during a time of dictatorship. Through the example of the parish priest, I began to understand better what justice is and how to serve with compassion and justice. As I ministered among the youth, I took on some of their enthusiasm. Even today, I keep in touch with some of those former youth leaders," she stated.

Once back in Rochester, she served as Hispanic pastoral associate at St. Michael and Our Lady of Perpetual Help parishes in Rochester. Now for 12 years she has ministered among Hispanics in the Finger Lakes counties of Yates, Ontario, Wayne and Seneca with offices in Geneva and Newark. Her heart "goes out to the undocumented and those seeking asylum who come to this country escaping violence and poverty and seeking a better life for their families. Too many are deported and separated from their families." "I love my ministry." Motto: Christ is alive in me today.





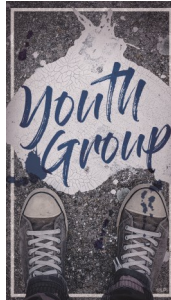

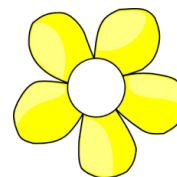
### Attention Camp Stella Maris Camper Alumni
