Todos hacemos promesas, pero no todos cumplimos esas promesas. A veces prometemos algo porque pensamos que la otra persona necesita escuchar algo positivo en el momento, pero cuando ese momento pasa, echamos la promesa por la ventana. Otras veces tenemos buenas intenciones, pero después no tenemos los medios para cumplir. Otras veces vamos a intentar hacerlo, pero otra persona nos convence que no es una buena idea. Otras veces prometemos algo y hacemos todo posible para lograr lo que sea necesario para cumplir con la promesa. ¿Cuál tipo de persona que hace promesas es usted? Miremos a Jesús.

Bueno, Jesús dijo que iba a resucitar y aunque los discípulos no supieron cómo iba a hacer eso, lo hizo-el cumplió su promesa. La noche ante de morirse, el prometió a sus discípulos a enviarles el Protector. Jesús dijo: "Les conviene que yo me vaya, porque mientras yo no me vaya el Protector no vendrá a ustedes. bre de Jesús sin miedo, y con mucha confianza. Es Pedro, quien había negado a Jesús tres veces ante de la muerte de Jesús, que ahora es el primer discípulo para proclamarlo. ¡Hurray! El Espíritu llegó y la promesa de Jesús se cumplió: el Espíritu tomó lo de Jesús revelándolo como Dios y así glorificando a


