

Fundraising at St. Michael's Raffle Winners, Tom Wahl's, and more

We learned last Fall that with South Main Street under construction, we would not be able to have our festival this year. The raffle and festival are among our biggest fundraisers. So, we knew we needed to come up with some new ideas. Last November we had a meeting to discuss new fundraising ideas. We selected four ideas to pursue.

1. The first was to have the raffle without the festival. We drew the winners on June 9th:

1st place – Yvonne MacTaggart 2nd place – Mary Tack 3rd place – Carolyn Mowry

With the parish making \$4,140 to support our ministry efforts.

- 2. The second was partnering with restaurants in Newark for fundraising nights where people could go, enjoy a meal, and we receive a portion of the gross sales. We just had our first restaurant night at Tom Wahl's on May 28th and the turn out of parishioners was amazing! Thank you for coming. Remember we got 15% of the food ordered (not including sales tax). We received a check for \$260.86
- 3. Pasta nights/pancake breakfast nights in our church hall—to be done after construction on South Main Street is completed.
- 4. Selling items with St. Michael's on them such as jackets or t-shirts—stay tuned for more in the Fall.

Señal de la Cruz

Una de la primeras cosas que una madre o padre enseña a su niño es hacer la señal de la cruz; entrando la iglesia el padre o la madre toma la mano de su hijo(a) y le ayuda meter sus dedos en el agua bendita a la entrada de la iglesia, y también le ayuda persignarse diciendo: "en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo." Esta es una oración; sabemos que Dios es Padre, Hijo y Espíritu y que en la oración estamos en comunicación con las tres personas de la Trinidad. Lo que hacemos en la iglesia será nuestra oración larga: la celebración de la Eucaristía.

Cada individuo pide la presencia de Dios y se reúne con los demás que entran la iglesia y se presentan frente Dios. Así vamos formando una comunidad de bautizados reunidos en oración. Tantas veces Jesús hablaba de su Padre y de la unión entre sí. En la Última Cena Él dijo que el Espíritu Santo iba a venir a ellos cuando Él no iba a estar con ellos. Cada persona de la Trinidad tiene un amor y una comunicación con las otras dos personas y hay armonía entre Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. Dios nos ayuda a vivir bien nuestras vidas y a veces decimos que es Jesucristo que nos enseña cómo vivir, pero es el Espíritu Santo que nos ayuda seguir ese camino fielmente, y es el Padre que creó todo para que podamos apreciar las maravillas de Dios. Por supuesto sabemos que las tres personas—Dios—estaban en cada acción porque hay un solo Dios.

Que demos gracias a Dios por nuestra creencia en Dios, por nuestro Bautismo y por nuestra capacidad de orar a un Dios de amor, misericordia, sabiduría y compasión. Es <u>un</u> Dios y nos acepta como somos, pidiéndonos entregarnos a Él y el camino que Jesucristo nos muestra en los evangelios. *Hermana Kay*

Starting July 1, 2019 the Parish Center hours will be changing. The office will now be closed on FRIDAY and opened on Thursday.


