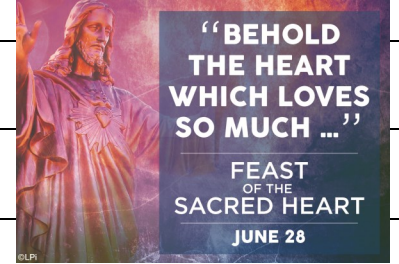

El Espíritu Santo Actúa por Medio de Nosotros

Creemos que Dios está presente en nuestras vidas y decimos que desde nuestro bautismo el Espíritu Santo habita en nosotros. Richard Rohr escribió el siguiente:

“La obra del Espíritu Santo en nuestras vidas es revelarnos la verdad de nuestro ser para que el camino de nuestro ser pueda igualarlo.” (Wm. Paul Young) El amor en ti, que es el Espíritu Santo en ti, siempre de alguna manera dice que sí. El amor no es algo que tú haces; el amor es algo que tú eres. Es tu verdadero ser. El amor es de dónde vienes y el amor es a dónde vas. No es algo que puedas comprar. No es algo que puedas alcanzar. Es la presencia de Dios en ti, llamada el Espíritu Santo o lo que algunos teólogos llaman gracia no creada.

No puedes fabricar esto por ninguna conducta correcta; no puedes hacer que Dios te ame una onza más de lo que Dios ya te ama. Puedes ir a la iglesia todos los días por el resto de tu vida. Dios no te va a amar más como Dios te ama en este momento.

Tampoco puedes hacer que Dios te ame una onza menos. Haz lo más terrible y Dios no te amaría menos. ¡No puedes cambiar la mente divina acerca de ti! El flujo es constante, total y 100 por ciento hacia tu vida.

No podemos disminuir el amor de Dios por nosotros. Sin embargo, lo que podemos hacer es aprender como creerlo, recibirlo, confiarlo, permitirlo y celebrarlo, aceptando la invitación de la Trinidad a unirse a la danza cósmica.

Catherine LaCugna escribió: “La naturaleza misma de Dios es buscar la más profunda comunión y amistad posible con cada una de las últimas criaturas en esta tierra. Esa es la descripción del trabajo de Dios. Eso es todo lo que es y lo único que puede mantenerte fuera de esta danza divina es el miedo o el odio a ti mismo.

...este es un universo muy seguro. No tienes nada que temer. Dios es para ti. ¡Dios está saltando hacia ti! Dios está a tu lado.”

Acéptalo; acepta a este Dios que te ama y desea actuar junto a ti y por medio de ti. Déjate

abierto a la obra de Dios dentro de ti. Así creceremos unidos en comunidad aquí en Geneva y será posible conquistar los corazones de muchos. *Hermana Kay*
