**The Power of Holy Communion**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,




There are many disturbing things happening in our world, in the Church even, and perhaps in our own lives. When evil touches us or those we love and causes harm, it can easily seem like darkness is stronger than light. Put another way, we can be tempted to think that God is absent, or that he doesn't care what happens. The truth of the matter is, while the Lord warned us that evil would be with us until the end of the world when God ultimately triumphs, we as Catholics possess many tools to overcome evil that we often underuse. I think the greatest 'unused gift' we have is the Holy Eucharist, and by 'unused' I mean that we often do not take full advantage of the power of receiving Holy Communion.

The Eucharist is Jesus, not only a symbol or a mere remembrance, but the Lord himself 'hidden' under the appearance of bread and wine. His Sacramental Presence exists because He wants to be near us because He loves us. Our response to this love has to be Faith: "Lord, I believe that you love me so much as to remain close to me, among us, in the Eucharist".

When we receive Communion, we receive Jesus himself; he gives Himself to us with all the miracle-working power of his divinity. In the Gospels Jesus would ask people, "What would you have me do for you?" He asks us the same question when he comes to us in Holy Communion. Sadly, though, we often don't think to listen! In the Gospels, before a miracle, he would ask if the person truly believed—this faith was his only 'price'. When we receive Communion, we can do so much good by asking for graces and help for ourselves, our families, and the world. Jesus just waits to be asked!

I'm convinced the world would look different if more Catholics used the power of Holy Communion. We have at our fingertips the very power of the death and resurrection of the Son of God! The next time the Risen Jesus comes to us in Holy Communion, let us welcome Him with true faith. Let us prepare our hearts by trust and by having true contrition for our sins. If we have anything serious on our conscience, let's go to confession and so prepare ourselves for a good and fruitful Communion. Also, why not consider attending daily Mass once a week? Why not consider paying a visit to the Blessed Sacrament in our chapel at least once or twice a week? If we allow the power of our Eucharistic Lord to grow, if we look with the eyes of faith in this encounter with the living God, not only will we and our families benefit, but somehow, mysteriously, so too will the universal Church, and even, the whole world

### Agua, sus Usos e Importancia en la Vida y la Fe

Tempestades en Luisiana han causado inundaciones y alguna destrucción.

India está listo a lanzar su segunda misión a la Luna para explorar el polo sur de la superficie lunar para conseguir datos sobre la presencia de agua en la Luna y su composición mineral. (¿Tenemos que traerlo al planeta Tierra cuando no haya bastante aquí?)

El sur de Asia está afectado por dos semanas de lluvia torrencial de los monzones e inundaciones—ya más de 100 personas han muerto in India, Bangladesh y Nepal.

El nivel de agua en Lagos Erie y Ontario ha subido, inundando pueblos a su orilla.

Hay hambruna en África debido a una escasez de lluvia y también por los conflictos en los países de Somalia, Sudan del Sur, Nigeria y Yemen.

Nestlé, la compañía más grande por la producción de comida y bebidas en el mundo, está sacando agua de un pueblo en Michigan (400 galones por minuto) por \$200 por año. Lo vende en botellas a la gente a quien originalmente pertenecía por una ganancia grande.

El cuerpo de un adulto tiene entre 50 y 75 % agua. Hay que mantener el agua contenida en el cuerpo porque si no, el individuo puede morir.

Deshidratación puede causar la mal función de los electrolitos de la persona.

En el Bautismo estamos bautizados con agua y el Espíritu Santo. El agua es un símbolo de vida, y siendo bautizados como cristianos católicos empezamos con la vida de Cristo fluyendo sobre nosotros—vivos en el Espíritu y miembros de la familia de Dios. Somos criaturas nuevas en Jesucristo. Debemos seguir el ejemplo de Cristo.

Tan importante es agua en todo sentido. Puede ser que en el futuro habrá guerras para conseguir agua y no solamente terreno. ¿Estamos listos para defender la acción que nos hizo católicos? El sacramento de Bautismo no es solamente importante el día que fuimos bautizados, pero nos da una dirección en nuestras vidas—una guía para vivir la vida. Esa agua de Bautismo debe manifestarse durante toda la vida. Nos impulsa a encontrar a Cristo en la Eucaristía. ¿Estamos listos a celebrar el culto eucarístico y vivir acciones de compasión, perdón, agradecimiento y amor? Realizamos esas porque recibimos el agua de vida en el Bautismo y seguimos a Cristo. *Hermana Kay*

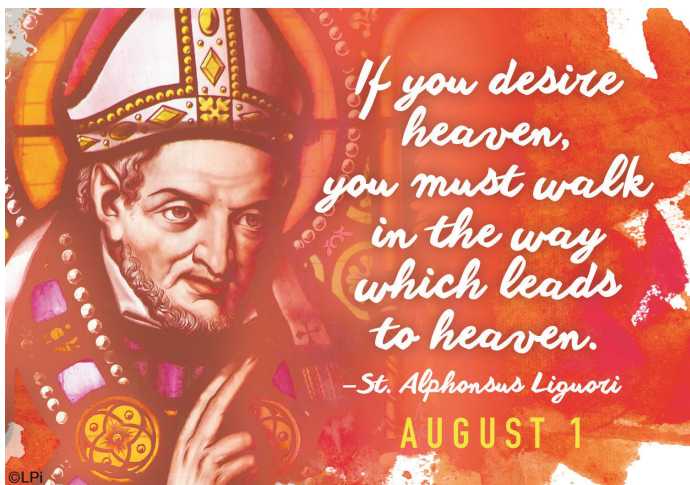
