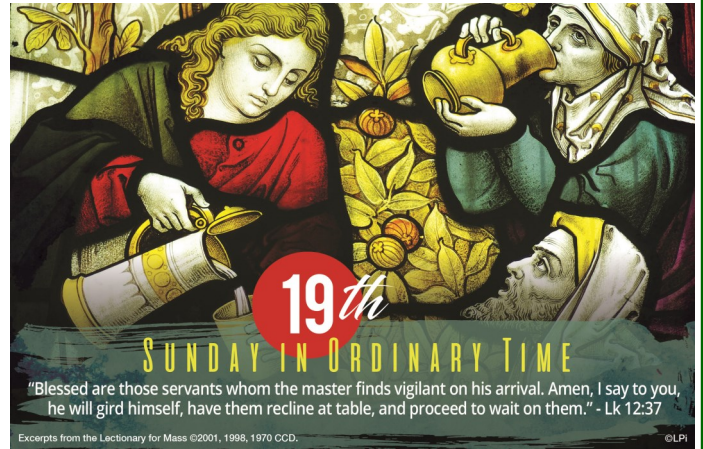

My Dear People.

Either last weekend or this weekend, depending on location, our Pastor, Fr Tedesche, has spoken at all the Masses on the clergy sexual abuse scandal that will once again make news and public outcry. As a newly ordained priest, just entering the ranks of the priesthood, I have inherited a very difficult situation and task. But because I have chosen to respond to the Lord's call when becoming a priest is associated, in some people's minds, with the most vile sins and disgraceful actions, I can speak boldly on the subject to you, who have shown such goodness to me in the few weeks that I've been in your midst.



What is this difficult task? It's not first that wearing a roman collar in public may easily invite scorn and insult. It's not that fewer and fewer people understand what priestly celibacy is or what it is not. It's not even that I will have to earn most people's trust long before it's given freely. What is most difficult to be a young priest in such an environment is that, because of the sins of certain priests and bishops, *good Catholics will be tempted to lose their confidence, belief and love in the priesthood itself.* And this, of course, is the devil's plan.

A distinctive aspect of our Catholic Faith is the belief that **God uses human mediation to bring salvation.** In other words, the channels of grace and mercy from Jesus Christ are given to us *with and through others.* A central aspect of this is the role of our Blessed Mother and all the saints. God uses them to pray for us and intercede on our behalf. But the other side of this coin is the Church as an institution with seven sacraments. God's plan is that He gives His help through visible means and uses weak human beings to be His instruments.

The Catholic priesthood is not a *human invention*, but a *divine one.* In fact, it is a *divine intervention* in human life. God wants us to be able to find Him, to access Him, to know Him everywhere, always, and easily because of the priesthood. **God wants to intervene in our ordinary lives by bringing us the Sacraments through the hands of the priest so He can be as near to us in a human, I would even say a humane way.** He wants us to know we are not alone on our often difficult path towards salvation .

No one should cease receiving medical treatment because of a bad doctor. Distrust the bad doctor, but not medicine or doctors in general. Distrust bad priests, but not Jesus. And beg our good Lord and His holy Mother to send you priests after His own heart, priests who will truly show you the Face of the love of Christ Himself.

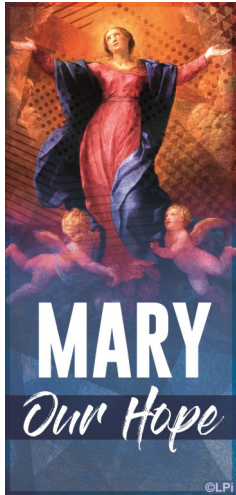
