



My Dear People,

It's very difficult to see our Mass times reduced and our parishes combined into ever larger and larger groupings. The cause, on the surface, is simple and evident: there are fewer people practicing the Faith, and there are even fewer priests. This can make us ask the question: why should our churches stay open? *Why do we want them to stay open*? What would our answer be?

Asking ourselves this question allows us to know how we really view our Catholic Faith. Is the Catholic religion just something nice from yesteryear when things seemed better? Many people today think the world would be a much better place if the Catholic Church were to die. You have only to read major newspapers across the country to find easy and well-articulated proof of it. The Church is divine, she can never die, but the practice of the Faith can and does die in individual lives, families and parts of the world, as all can see. And so, the question remains—why should our churches stay open? The answer needs to be more than that it would be more comfortable for us if they do so.

May I pose, rhetorically, another question? Why did I become a priest? Well, firstly, God called me, but *why did I want to answer* this call? This I can answer easily—for the salvation of souls. It is the knowledge that people need the power of the Sacraments to bring them to the salvation of Jesus Christ. In other words, the priest lives to be able to bring Jesus Christ to the people through the Sacraments, and lead the people through the trials, the challenges and the sufferings of this life back to God and to Heaven. The crowning masterpiece of this divine encounter is the Holy Mass.

Christianity flourished and grew in the first centuries when professing Faith in Christ meant certain death. This same Faith was spread to our American continent in the most adverse circumstances and conditions. In how many parts of the world do Catholics long to be able to attend Mass and go to confession but cannot because of persecution? or because there are no priests available? In Europe many beautiful churches sit empty with no Sacraments.

My dear People, let us not be indifferent or casual about what we still have. Future generations depend on the choices we make today. Our Blessed Lord invites; He never forces. But let us heed and respond to the invitation while we still can.

## FAMILY MINISTRY

Read or retell in your own words, the three stories from the Gospel. Ask your children to recall games they play that involve losing or hiding something and then finding it. (Hide and Go Seek, Ghost in the Graveyard, Button, Button, Who's Got the Button?) Talk about how exciting it is to find the person or thing being looked for.

Ask your children if they have any memories of losing something special or being lost themselves. Share the stories as well as the fears or feelings. Then tell them that just as you would go to any length to find and bring them home if they were lost, so too would God. That is what Jesus is telling us in the three stories. No matter what we do, no matter how wrong we are, God, our loving father, is always anxious to forgive us and welcome us back

home.
