

The Power of the Rosary

My Dear People,

October 7th is the Feast of the Holy Rosary.

Its origin is the Battle of Lepanto, a decisive military battle against the Ottoman Empire, which threatened to take over all of Europe. In fact, the Christian armies were so outnumbered that defeat seemed inevitable. The saintly Pope Pius V called upon all nations to pray the rosary for protection. The Battle of Lepanto was the largest naval battle in Western history since ancient times, involving some 490 warships. Contrary to expected odds, the Christian fleet was able to defend itself and ultimately win. In gratitude for what was clearly divine intervention, the Pope dedicated a Feast in honor of ‘Our Lady of Victory’, later changed to the Holy Rosary, in honor of the prayer which, quite literally, saved Europe.

For this reason, October is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Some weeks ago, I wrote to you about the power of the Rosary. No single prayer is so recommended by the Popes and by the Church in past centuries. The reason is obvious; time and again the Blessed Virgin has appeared to different saints and asked them—*told them*—to pray the Rosary. In recent times, she appeared in Lourdes, France. You have only to go there to see walls lined with crutches, given as a testimony to the healing intercession of Mary. And the miracles of Lourdes are no product of wishful thinking or superstition. Secular scientists from the very beginning, some of whom were unbelievers, have documented them meticulously. Again, in Fatima, Portugal, in 1917, Our Lady appeared to three shepherd children, telling them that Catholics throughout the world needed to pray the rosary daily for peace and for the salvation of souls. These simple peasants were anything but manipulators, and as proof, a miracle witnessed by over 60,000 people occurred during Mary’s final apparition. The Church, more cautious and skeptical than one could imagine when it comes to purported visions and miracles, gave its approval to these two great events as worthy of credibility for the faithful. **But, if we speak of external manifestations of the power of praying the Rosary, what shall we say of the internal and spiritual miracles, far greater and even uncountable?**

Often, it takes a crisis or a tragedy to wake us up to the need of prayer. No one is an atheist in a foxhole. We may be sensitive to crises of health and of war, but are we as sensitive to the dangers of spiritual health and spiritual battle? Everyone is in need of God’s power, His healing, and His peace. Pray the rosary, and let this magnificent prayer be the means of Jesus’ victory in your life, your families, and in our world.



Por medio de los sacramentos de Bautismo y de Confirmación hemos recibido una fe en Dios Padre, Hijo y el Espíritu Santo y una fortaleza de nuestra fe. Supuestamente en la celebración de la Confirmación el individuo profesa más firmemente su fe en Dios Padre, Jesucristo y el Espíritu Santo. El (ella) confirma las creencias que sus padres habían aceptado para él. El (ella) dice que sí a cada pregunta sobre las creencias de la fe católica que el obispo o su representante hace. San Pablo escribe en la carta a Timoteo que debe conformar su predicación a la sólida doctrina que había recibido sobre la fe y el amor. Si fue buen consejo para Timoteo, también es buen consejo para nosotros hoy. Todo eso es basado en Jesucristo y lo que él había enseñado.

Bueno, aquí estamos los discípulos de Cristo, pero muchos desean recibir los sacramentos como cosas en vez de celebraciones de la fe que tenemos en Dios. La fe no es solamente tener unas explicaciones de las creencias del Credo de los Apóstoles y del Credo de Nicea. Tenemos que conocer a Jesucristo personalmente y dejar la vida de Cristo entrar y guiar nuestras vidas.

Ciertamente tenemos que dar testimonio de Cristo y según San Pablo debemos tener una sólida base de instrucción en Jesucristo. Ah, tenemos que conocer a Cristo por prestar atención a las lecturas y homilias en las Misas. Hay que decidir leer las Escrituras regularmente e informarse de su significado en el tiempo de Jesús y en nuestro tiempo y decidir cómo ponerlas en acción hoy en sus vidas. Tenemos grupos bíblicos y los libritos de *Palabra entre Nosotros* como ayudas en esto.

Usando parte de una oración bautismal de su tiempo Pablo nos pide guardar el tesoro recibido en Bautismo de una fe en Jesucristo y vivirlo, buscando justicia, piedad, caridad, amor, y paciencia. Que busquen una base firme de su fe.


