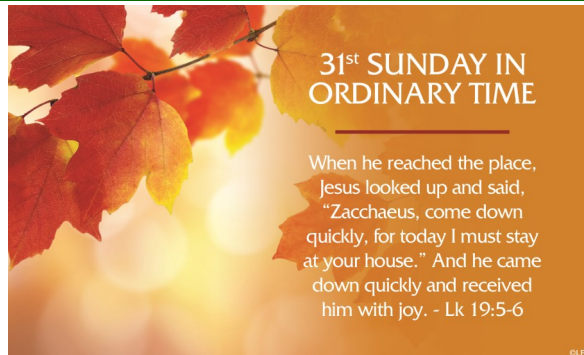

**Purification And Salvation
Our Path To God**





My Dear People,

November is the month when we remember in a special way those who have died, since **November 2nd is All Souls Day, or the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed.** The day preceding is the Feast of All Saint's, where the Church celebrates all the saints in heaven, especially those who will never be publicly recognized. **But All Souls Day is about those who have died in God's friendship and are not yet in heaven,** they are waiting to enter the vision and possession of God. They are not in hell, since they have been saved. Then where are they? In a 'place' or a state called Purgatory, where they are being cleansed and undergoing the final process of transformation to be worthy for heaven. So in November, we not only *remember* the souls who have died, but we *pray for them*, since our prayers can intensify and hasten the process.

The Catechism explains it like this: "*All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore Judas Maccabeus made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." (2 Maccabees 12:46) From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead.*" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraphs 1030-1032).

Salvation consists, not in a single choice of Faith that is made once and for all that cannot be revoked, but in *living out daily* God's pattern and plan for us to know, love and serve Him in Jesus. **While the initial choice or act of Baptism is essential, the Christian life is rather one of a progressive transformation, by God's grace and our cooperation with it, to become the person we need to be for heaven.** This is why we have the 7 Sacraments, to accomplish this transformation. But we can also hinder it by sin and lack of generosity, even if we're living in God's friendship. When we die and are not perfectly transformed, God is merciful. He allows us to continue it after death. But like on earth, this transformation is painful because it involves change. This is why our prayers can and do help.

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

¿Vivimos Nuestra Llamada a Ser Cristianos?

Las lecturas de hoy hablan de la llamada de Dios a nosotros. Dios llama a cada individuo a seguirlo—primero por su Bautismo y más tarde en la vida por medio de oración, retiros, prédicas, otras personas, libros... El Bautismo nos muestra el camino, y es Cristo quien es el Camino y Él nos guía con su Luz. Estamos llamados a seguirlo y vivir su misión. Dios sigue llamándonos durante toda la vida, y es nuestra decisión si vamos a responderle positivamente cada vez. Una llamada no basta. Tenemos un Dios que nos ama tanto que Dios sigue llamando y guiando.

Pero ¿por qué vamos a seguir a Dios Jesucristo si no lo conocemos? No vamos a poner confianza en alguien que no conocemos y ciertamente no vamos a dedicar nuestras vidas de ser verdaderos cristianos si no conocemos el líder de Cristianismo—Jesucristo. ¿Cómo vamos a ser cristianos verdaderos si no pasamos algún tiempo con Cristo? ¿Cómo vamos a vivir la misión de Jesucristo si no leemos y conocemos el Nuevo Testamento y no hemos reflexionado sobre las acciones y palabras de Jesucristo?

Algunos padres dicen que van a bautizar a sus hijos porque sus propios padres lo habían hecho con ellos, y ahora ellos son Católicos. Quieren hacer eso con sus hijos, pero demasiado veces no han logrado a conocer bien y amar bien a Jesucristo. Frecuentemente Jesús es un nombre en un rezo o en un libro o es alguien de quien se habla en una prédica. Pero les falta llegar a tener una relación verdadera y de amor con Jesucristo.

Cristo nos llama y sigue llamándonos, y quiere que formemos una relación con Él. Desde nuestro Bautismo hemos tenido una llamada a ser otros Cristos, a vivir como Jesucristo, a amar como Cristo, a realizar la misión de Jesucristo.

Zaqueo en el evangelio de hoy quería conocer a Jesús. Seguramente había escuchado algo sobre Él; siendo bajo de estatura subió un árbol para verlo como algunos hacen cuando el Papa visita otros países. Quieren decir que han visto el Papa. Bueno, Zaqueo vio Jesús, pero Jesús le hizo una llamada, diciendo que iba a ir a su casa. Muy contento Zaqueo lo recibió en su casa, y al aceptar a Jesús para quedarse en su casa, a la vez se abrió a un cambio de vida. Así es para nosotros; al conocer a Jesucristo de cerca, al abrir nuestros corazones a su persona y sus enseñanzas, estamos abriéndonos a conversión como Zaqueo quien iba a ayudar a los pobres y admitió haber cometido fraude. Un verdadero conocimiento de Jesús nos causa ser honestos con nosotros mismos, con Cristo y con los demás.

Todos hemos recibido la llamada de Cristo, pero ¿todos estamos respondiendo que sí a ella? ¿Conoces bien a ese Cristo que llama tu nombre?
