

My Dear People.



Manifestación de la Luz de Dios

La presencia tan especial se presenta en la biblia de distintas maneras. Hoy celebramos cómo Jesús se dio a conocer a tres sabios cuando Él era un bebé. La tradición les da a esos tres los nombres de Gaspar, Melchor y Baltasar—los que aparecen del oriente para adorar a Jesús, ofreciéndole los regalos simbólicos de oro, incienso y mirra.

Mateo en su evangelio menciona que unos sabios siguieron una brillante estrella para adorar y llevar regalos al niño Jesús. Esta fiesta junto con la de Navidad a veces se refiere como una gran fiesta de la luz. El Papa Juan Pablo II habló de esta luz en una homilía en 2002. Jesucristo nació siendo luz de los pueblos. Al encarnarse, Dios se manifestó como luz—como una luz externa en la historia y también dentro de los seres humanos en su historia personal. Así Cristo dio nuevo valor a nuestra existencia en la tierra. Esta luz brilla en las tinieblas. Jesucristo, el Mesías que se manifestó en Belén a los pastores, hoy en esta fiesta se revela como luz de los pueblos de todos los tiempos y de todos los lugares. Para los Magos sabios la luz del "rey de los judíos ha nacido" toma la forma de un astro celeste, tan brillante que atrae su mirada y los guía hasta Jerusalén.

Esa estrella nos habla a nosotros en nuestro tiempo de la verdad y el deseo de conocer lo absoluto. Muchos de nosotros deseamos una "estrella" para guiarnos a lo largo de nuestro camino en la tierra. Ambos: individuos y naciones necesitan un guía. Dios al principio había elegido a Israel para recibir la Luz, pero extendió su elección a todos los pueblos. Así nació la Iglesia a la cual pertenecemos: mujeres, hombres, niños—todos reunidos en Cristo y guiados por el Espíritu Santo.

Quizás tenemos una idea hacia dónde queremos ir, pero no conocemos el camino. Es Cristo quien es la Luz que nos manda a penetrar las tinieblas, y es su Espíritu que nos va a guiar para poder hacerlo. Como Cristo había acompañado a la gente de Palestina, es su Espíritu que nos acompaña y nos ayuda a compartir las Buenas Nuevas con los demás. Pidan

la ayuda del Espíritu Santo. Reconozcan a Jesucristo como la Luz del mundo. Compartan esas Buenas Noticias. Esa noticia no es solamente para guardar para sí mismos, sino es para ser compartido.
