St Joseph and the Power of Fatherhood

3rdS^{unday}

Of Advent

My Dear People,

Last week I wrote to you about Our Lady. But there is another Saint we should meditate on in a special way during Advent- St. Joseph; not only because of his unique role as Foster Father of Jesus and husband of Mary, but as special protector of family life and model of manhood. It's not hard to see that the family as Christians understand it is under heavy and serious attack. Admittedly, from the beginning, family life has always been 'attacked' by selfishness and sin. The lifelong commitment of fidelity to a single person, self-sacrificial love, service, mutual respect, communication, and the burdens of raising children are not easy things that we do promptly, well and consistently. But now marriages and families face another threat more subtle and harmful: the rejection that marriage itself is good, that it's classical model is even legitimate or normative, and that lifelong commitment is at all possible or healthy. And as our Catholic identity becomes weakened, more and more young people accept uncritically the so-called secular model of marriage and family life, learned from television programs and Hollywood, not from the Gospel or God's grace.

While this complex issue is not easily solved, one thing is certain- often many young men are not exhibiting the necessary qualities to be good husbands and fathers. Marriage needs maturity and commitment to work, and maturity and commitment require young men to "step up". But for young men to become virtuous, mature men have to hold them accountable and challenge them to be faithful Catholics, to follow a godly pattern, and not a secular pattern of manhood. It's easy to point fingers and complain, but fathers and grandfathers themselves need to "step up" to teach younger men to do the same and not be afraid of the pushback. Boys and men need mentorship, discipline and guidance from their fathers or another male role model to grow up, love maturely, and have the courage to commit to something or someone besides themselves, namely, to their wives and children, and ultimately, to be faithful to God.

This is why we need St Joseph. St. Joseph is far more than just an example for us, (though that he is and powerfully), **he is also our protector and intercessor in heaven**. He can help us and our families in ways we can't do on our own. Not only men, but all of us, mothers and grandmothers included, can pray to him to help young men be faithful Catholics. Without this, the Faith cannot be passed on to another generation nor stable family life assured. The devil attacks Christian families with a vengeance, but St Joseph is more powerful! May he who was chosen to be the chaste spouse of the Mother of God and for this was called "Father" by the Lord Himself teach us to know and love Jesus and Mary as he did this Christmas.




¡Salve Madre de América! Celestial Misionera del
