

Las Antífonas "O"

Quizás sabes algo de las antífonas de la "Oh". Entre el 17 y 23 de diciembre la Iglesia las canta en el Oficio de Vísperas. Son llamadas al Mesías, recordando las ansias de los pueblos antes de su venida histórica, y a la vez manifiestan los sentimientos con que le espera la Iglesia en los días antes de la celebración del nacimiento del Salvador. Son breves oraciones compuestas en los siglos 7 y 8 dirigidas a Jesucristo, que condensan el espíritu del Adviento y la Navidad. Ante el misterio de Dios hecho hombre la Iglesia expresa admiración "Oh" y una súplica "ven." Cada antífona empieza con "Oh", seguida de un título mesiánico tomado del Antiguo Testamento, pero entendido con lo que pasó en el Nuevo Testamento. Aclamamos a Jesús el Mesías, reconociendo todo lo que representa para nosotros. Ahora nosotros queremos que Cristo nazca en nosotros. Algunas reflexiones de Chittister y Leddy siguen:

Oh ven, Sabiduría, santa Palabra de Dios. La sabiduría nos viene cuando nos preguntamos que ha hecho para nosotros nuestro conocimiento. ¿Que ve Dios en todo esto? Sabiduría puede ser una consecuencia del amando.

Oh ven, Dios de fuerza. No se habla de poder. La fuerza Dios dio a Moisés para poder guiar los esclavos por el desierto, y para mantener la visión de Dios cuando los otros estaban buscando otro dios. Para nosotros necesitamos fuerza para mantener esperanza y sueños, siguiendo adelante a pesar de dificultades.

Oh ven, flor de la raíz del tronco de Jesé. Jesé, un antepasado de David, empezó la espera en esperanza y fe, aunque nunca vio la conclusión. El creyó aunque había poco en que creer. Tenemos que tener paciencia en nuestras propias vidas; las frutas van a aparecer.

Oh ven, Llave de David. Es del linaje de David que Cristo vino. Cristo debe ser la llave a dónde trabajamos, cómo pensamos y qué decimos. Es Cristo de Belén que nos enseña a identificar con los pobres. Es Cristo de las Bienaventuranzas que nos ayuda medir los valores en la vida. Es Cristo en la cruz quien nos enseña el porqué de dar su vida.

Oh ven, Oriente, luz y resplandor. En las tinieblas de la vida, Cristo es la venida de esperanza en la vida. Tenemos que dejar la vida buena, el egoísmo y nuestra independencia para permitir la luz y el amor de Dios iluminar nuestras vidas.

Oh ven, Dios de toda la Tierra. Dios no es un Dios de una tribu, no de una parte del mundo, sino de todo el mundo. Cuando Dios entra nuestras vidas y corazones, no habrá espacio para nacionalismo militarista, ni sexismo, ni racismo. La presencia de Dios nos ayuda a ver lo que tenemos en común, no todas las diferencias. Debemos dar gracias a Dios Emanuel, Dios con todos nosotros en toda nuestra variedad.

My Dear People,

The popular advent hymn *O Come, O Come Emmanuel*, has very ancient origins. It is based on the official prayer of the Church called the *Divine Office* daily sung or said by priests, monks and nuns, which is an arrangement and cycle of Psalms, biblical readings and hymns. *O Come, O Come Emmanuel*, then, is based on the antiphons which go with Our Lady's great hymn of praise, the *Magnificat*: 'My soul magnifies the Lord...'. Solemnly beginning on December 17th up till Christmas, each starts with an invocation of a title of the Messiah: "O Wisdom", "O Most High", "O Root of Jesse", and so forth. Each of these mysterious titles also invoke the special graces and power that flow to us from Our Lord's prerogatives or privileges as Son of God. For example, invoking Christ as "O Key of David", given the power to open and shut, we ask Him to unlock our spiritual captivity to sin, and to lead us out of darkness and the shadow of death.

The ways in which Jesus comes to help us far exceed the seven titles of these ancient antiphons. They are as numerous and as varied as all the different sins, problems, and wounds that plague us. Our Lord is the solution to everything, and we must constantly remind ourselves of this. However impossible these things may seem or truly be, we have to understand that God is more powerful. He is not only Savior to humanity in general, He is *Savior to me*. But we must invoke Him, we must open ourselves up to this saving power by our Faith, and ask! The beautiful canticle of praise that the Church puts of the lips her children through the *Divine Office* represents the prayers and actual needs of all the Christian peoples throughout the world. This means that the different invocations to Christ sung in *O Come, O Come Emmanuel* are not merely poetic inventions, but show the reality of our need and of His saving, all-powerful help. Emmanuel means "*God is with us*". Such a simple truth, and yet, in it, is contained *everything*.
