**Why do we have to struggle?**



My Dear People,

It can sometimes feel like God doesn't treat His friends very well. Living a serious Christian life can be frustrating at times, even when we are truly doing our best and seemingly using all the means (like prayer and the sacraments) God gives us to stay close to Him and to do His will, to serve him and others for love of him.

But if you read the lives of the saints, and especially the Bible itself, you see that this frustration finds echo among God's closest friends and helpers. No sooner does it seem that God sets us on the right path, and makes sure that his way is clear for us that obstacles, interior and exterior, come up to make it more and more difficult. Some people have a very profound and deep conversion, discovering the truth of their Catholic Faith and how much God loves them, feeling the desire to love and serve him back, and then find that all the old habits of sin and self rise up to fight back. It seems like an authentic and sincere Christian life is unattainable, reserved for an elite few.



But this is just it- this struggle *is the authentic Christian life*, this is *what it means* to follow Jesus and to try to know and love Him. To follow Jesus is to follow Him *as we really are*, and not as we would wish to be, in all the ugliness of real life, in the circumstances that are anything but ideal, or so it would seem...

The Cross that Our Lord would give us isn't the one we would carry grandly and elegantly and heroically, but the one (or ones) like His, that is, an instrument of torture that God can use to save us. Jesus' cross was anything but beautiful, but His love made it the instrument of our salvation, of my salvation, and yours.

God lets His friends struggle, not because He's abandoned them, but because He loves them, and He knows the best way to teach us to love in the way that will prepare us for heaven. What happens in heaven? God gives Himself to us eternally in an ecstasy of joy and happiness. How is my daily struggle a preparation for this? Well, it's teaching me, painfully, slowly, how much I need God more than myself, and letting Him enter into my innermost being by making my Faith and Hope in His power grow. The very fact that I don't always feel this freedom is how He's actually freeing me, I am dying to be able to rise in Him. His power is made strong in human weakness, in my weakness, in *your weakness*.

Don't fear your struggles, only fear not giving them to God. He knows how to use them, He's God. That's the secret of the Cross, which for us as Christians, however hard it may seem, is a secret of *love*.

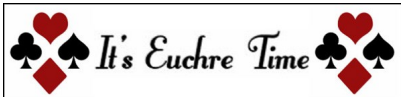

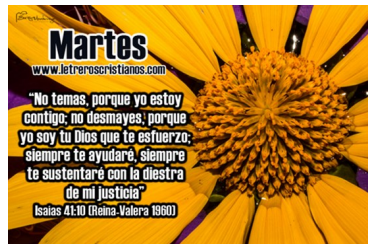
